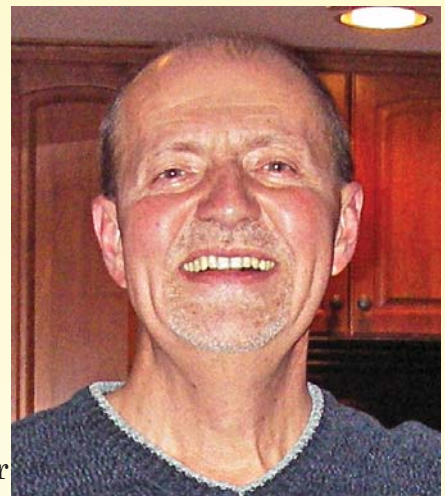

Some Possibly Useful Information

1. ARRL / OVH Field Day is still quite a long way off (June 22-23, 2013), but the ARRL has issued its Field Day info package at: <http://www.arrl.org/files/file/Field-Day/2013/2013%20FD%20Packet%20Version%201.pdf> If you are “new” to Field Day, download a copy and read it; if you think you know everything about Field Day, you should read it too because you probably don’t know everything.

2. FCC greatly expands “experimental license” procedures. Those who like to follow the wandering of the FCC and to read fine print should get a copy of the FCC’s recently published Report & Order (FCC 13-15) which can be downloaded at: http://hraunfoss.fcc.gov/edocs_public/attachmatch/FCC-13-15A1_Rcd.pdf Will this adversely affect ham radio operations by increasing interference level on the ham bands? It appears it could, but we will have to wait to see once it is implemented.

3. ITU - International Radio Regulations. The International Telecommunications Union (ITU) is a UN related organization which is responsible under treaties for the International Radio Regulations. Until very recently, these fine print documents were only available at great expense. Now, at last, you can download them without charge if you wish to learn more about that subject. Go to: <http://www.itu.int/pub/R-REG-RR-2012>

4. Antennas & Home Owners Associations. Many hams who have not been thinking ahead learn unhappily that their ability to erect or place outdoor antennas at or near their place of residence is restricted by lease terms or home owner association restrictions. It is estimated that as many as 35% to 45% of all hams are affected by such restrictions today. The short answer is to be sure to get copies of all pertinent documents and read them carefully before you lease or purchase any real property to avoid surprises. If you are confronting such a surprise or considering purchasing real property where you may want to use ham radios, be sure to check out the ARRL publication: Antenna Zoning for the Radio Amateur. It may seem pricey at \$50, but that amount is almost insignificant compared to the costs of legal proceedings which can arise due to ignorance, mistake or misunderstanding. In some situations, the impediment to putting up a desired antenna can come from a local municipal or county government; this text provides many insights on how to deal with and work around such impediments when they arise. The author of that text (Fred / K1VR) is a bona fide expert on the entire subject, and maintains a useful web site in support of the text. 4. Gmail users. Many of us use the excellent gmail system provided by Google for various purposes. One concern, disadvantage or potential problem is that gmail emails (and attachments) remain on Google's servers unless you forward them to yourself, one by one, and then delete them from the Google server. This situation attracted the attention of some smarter people who provided an easier solution for bulk downloading of gmail emails from Google's server. For details, check out <http://www.gmail-backup.com> where a free application is available; you will need to spend some time reading and thinking in order to use this application effectively, but the good news is that it does work well.

5. Jim / K9YK maintains a very useful web page with links to many articles and PowerPoint presentations he had written about audio, filtering, elimination of audio interference from RF, microphones, etc. He operates a business dealing with those types of matters and most certainly is a real expert in that subject area.

6. Tektronix Oscilloscopes and Test Equipment. Tektronix has an lengthy list of tutorial and informational videos on youtube.com To find them, search Tektronix on YouTube. Some of the videos also offer downloadable PDF files which supplement the video and provide additional information.

7. The North East Weak Signal Group, an ARRL affiliated club, maintains a web site with a lot of helpful information about VHF and UHF equipment and operations at <http://www.newsvhf.com> This group also sponsors the annual Eastern VHF/UHF Conference, now in its 39th year.

8. High Power Operators. Harbach Electronics of Ohio is discontinuing its support for the Peter Dahl line of high performance, high power transformers which were available for many years. Electronic Products Design, Inc. in North Carolina is another source of high power and custom transformers. Go to <http://epd-inc.com/>

9. Wallwarts, Wall Adapter Power Supplies. These types of power supplies have become ubiquitous, so much so that we can have difficulties or even serious problems if pick the wrong one out of large box of "spares" or chose a replacement which doesn't have adequate capacity or overheats. Most put out DC (at various predetermined voltages), but some put out AC (at various predetermined voltages); the standard connector sizes are often very similar, and equipment can be easily damaged or destroyed if the wrong one is plugged in. Some are RF noisy. This is not high tech stuff, but there is still a lot to learn and to avoid making repeated mistakes such as destroying equipment by plugging in the wrong one.
