National Parks on the Air (NPOTA) Update - by John / KG4NXT

The NPOTA contest ran during Calendar 2016 and has now finished. Some of the participants, including KG4NXT, are reporting "National Parks Withdrawal". It was an excellent contest and many OVH members participated.

You could participate either as a "Activator" or a "Chaser". If you went to the national park and operated, you were an activator. If you contacted stations in a national park, you were a chaser. You had to record your QSO in the logbook of the world to make it count.

David, KK4ZUU, helped kick off the contest by activating Manassas battlefield on 1/1/2016. John, KG4NXT, and Theresa, KG4TVM, visited and helped him set up. The top club activator was David, W5DDR, who is an inactive OVH member. David had 50 activations and was ranked 3rd highest activator in Virginia; he worked one station from Mozambique while operating as an activator.


Next, we had Terry, KC4DV, who had 19 activations and was ranked 17th in Virginia. Terry also sponsored a club event at the Manassas Battlefield which showed people how to Cont'd on page 6

activate. David, KK4ZUU, had 7 activations and was ranked 22nd in Virginia.

David, W5DDR, was also the top chaser. He had 282 parks for a rank of 485 nationally. Next was John, KG4NXT, with 174 parks for a rank of 835 nationally. Wayne, N7QLK, had 3d place in the club with 7 parks and 5083 rank nationally. Terry, KC4DV, has 6 parks for a ranks of 5517 nationally. David, KK4ZUU, had 2 parks for a rank of 9620 nationally. Stu, WP4PR, had one park for a national rank of 11583. Al Dugas, KB4BHB, worked at least one national park but does not have logbook of the world. All of the above number are as of 1/7/2017. They could change slightly because operators can still add contacts to logbook of world and have them count until 1/31/2017.

Expected Useful Coverage for the new 442.2 Repeater at Mount Pone

Ken / KE2N has provided the following "Radio Mobile" coverage prediction map the expected useful coverage area for the new 442.2 Repeater located at Mt Pone. "Useful Coverage" has been computed for a "typical" mobile station; fixed stations with high antennas will, of course, experience a longer range.

Pending Virginia Legislation Potentially Affecting Mobile Ham Radio Operations

If you have been following the OVH email reflector recently, you are aware that certain overly broad legislation now pending before the Virginia General Assembly threatens to declare mobile ham radio operations illegal for safety reasons. The true reason for the legislation is simply to prohibit the use of cellular telephones while in motion. At last look, the legislation contains an exemption for CB radio operation. The email threads on the OVH reflector suggest specific ways for contacting your Virginia representatives to complain about this. Please do so!

This an very good primer and technical reference resource for all of the many topics presented; despite being 20 years old, virtually all technical information in this set is still valid.
