"Cellular Telephone" Bills Pose Potential Problems for Ham Radio Operation

Bills aimed at thwarting "driving while cellular" and "driving while distracted" behavior have been introduced in several states, and most are worded broadly enough to proscribe Amateur Radio mobile operation. ARRL Regulatory Information Specialist Dan Henderson, N1ND, so far has catalogued 10 active pieces of legislation. Bills introduced in Montana and New Mexico have been sidelined for now, but related measures — more than one in some states — remain alive in Georgia, Oregon, Texas, Vermont, Washington and Wyoming. Henderson reports that ARRL Field Organization volunteers and members called the League's attention to the various pieces of pending legislation, none of which specifically exempt Amateur Radio mobile operation.

Nominations invited for Amateur Radio Newsline Young Ham of the Year Award

Nominations are now being accepted for the 2007 Amateur Radio Newsline Young Ham of the Year (YHOTY) Award. The award recognizes a radio amateur 18 years old or younger who has used ham radio to significantly contribute to the benefit of Amateur Radio, to the state of the communications art or to the community or nation. Nominations are being accepted for Amateur Radio licensees living in the 48 contiguous United States, Puerto Rico and the 10 Canadian provinces. Nominations and supporting materials must be submitted before May 30, 2007, on an official application. Download a nomination form or send a self-addressed, stamped envelope to 2007 Young Ham of the Year Award, c/o Newsline, 28197 Robin Ave, Santa Clarita, CA 91350. Nominations may be made online using a Web form, but supporting materials must be submitted separately. Presentation of the 2007 YHOTY Award will take place in August at the Huntsville Hamfest in Alabama, site of the 2007 ARRL National Convention. There's more information on the YHOTY Web site.

BPL Study Bill Gains Cosponsors

A bill in the US House of Representatives calling on the FCC to study the interference potential of

broadband over power line (BPL) technology and report its findings back to Congress has gained two cosponsors, US Rep Mike Ross, WD5DVR (D-AR), reports. They are US Rep Steve Israel (D-NY) and US Rep Ron Paul (R-TX). One of two radio amateurs in the House, Ross submitted the "Emergency Amateur Radio Interference Protection Act of 2007" (HR 462) on January 12. Last year, the US House passed a telecommunications bill, HR 5252, containing language that Ross proposed requiring the FCC to study the interference potential of BPL systems. The study requirement did not make its way into the final version of the bill, however. In a letter to his House colleagues inviting additional cosponsors, Ross emphasized that his primary goal is to minimize BPL's interference potential.

Radio Amateurs Sprinkled among Future Space Station Crews

NASA and its International Space Station partners have announced the expected ISS crew complements for the next two years, and the list includes several Amateur Radio licensees. The crew members comprise three ISS expeditions represent four space agencies. Assignments include the first long-duration station flight for a Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency, JAXA, astronaut and the second long-duration station flight for a European Space Agency, ESA, astronaut.

Cool Website of the Month?

A page on a website [http://f6fvy.free.fr/qthLocator/fullScreen.php] put up by F6FVY allows the user to zoom in on a Google Map to the center location designated by a [6 unit] Grid Locator which the user inputs by a form OR to determine the [6 unit] Grid Locater for a particular location which the user click on with his mouse on the displayed Google Map. You will need a DSL or better connection to use this effectively.

Challenge to OVH Member Programming Gurus!

Why not add a comparable page with this same functionality to the OVH website, but adapted to start up with a display of a map of the Eastern part of North America or the Washington, D.C. area instead of Europe as on F6FVY's webpage?

Considerations: 1. Google will issue OVH a needed "license key" for non-commercial use to interactively use Google Maps for no charge with a registration and 2. F6FVY states that his Javascript code [embedded in his webpage] may be reused or modified without charge as long as he is noted as its author. What else is needed? Almost nothing: a simple PHP routine will be needed to convert a [6 unit] Grid Locator received through a webpage form to latitude and longitude coordinates [the formulas to do that are well known]. The Guru will also need to figure out how to use the published Google Maps API to make a few minor adjustments [e.g. for the initial map displayed]. The amount of "work" needed to do this is very limited: simple testing reveals that the functionality on F6FVY s webpage is still present when that page is called up from a local computer! Who is smart enough to do this?

Follow up on the note about Best Practices For Viewing PDF Files

Several comments were received including recommendations for use of the "free" PDF reader from foxitsoftware.com. The FoxIt PDF Reader is also capable of full screen mode viewing of PDF files as descibed in that note for Adobe Reader [and Acrobat] although the FoxIt Reader uses [requires] different keychords for that functionality.

The "free" and the licensed version of FoxIt PDF Reader has one undisputable and pronounced advantage over the "free" Adobe PDF Reader: it starts up and initializes much faster than Adobe Reader. The Adobe products [both Reader and Acrobat include a lot of bloatware [rarely, if ever, needed or used] features which cannot be turned off and which very much slow down start up and initialization. However, the Adobe products are strictly compliant with the published PDF specifications; the current version of the FoxIt Reader product [at least the licensed version tested by your Editor] does not appear to be and it gives no "warning" message when it cannot comply with that specification. Current versions of the PDF specification permit use of layers within PDF pages; PDF files created by applications which used the multilayer features during initial file creation are now not uncommonly encountered; good practice during PDF file creation is to merge down no longer needed separate layers used during initial file creation to an earlier version PDF file specification, but content creators do not always do that. Limited testing by your Editor revealed that the current licensed version of the FoxIt Reader does not always properly display multilayer PDF pages, and provides no "warning" of any problem, sometimes even when a particular layer is not being displayed at all. This deficiency was first observed in FoxIt Reader when it failed to display a scanned handwritten overlay over a textual document; the Adobe products either displayed the page properly or gave a "warning" message that there might be a problem because the PDF file was based on a later PDF file specification. Conclusion: do not use FoxIt Reader for "mission critical" application unless you have verified that the PDF files to be viewed conform to one of the older PDF file specifications (e.g. Versions 1.3 or 1.4) which you are sure FoxIt Reader can display properly.
