

Spotlight on Members

This month: Clarence / K4CNM

I gave up my day job in early December 2011 after forty years as a civilian engineer for the US Army. Since that time I have divided my time among home projects, ham radio, and my two-year old granddaughter. (The picture to the left below also shows my wife, Darlene and my granddaughter, Chloe.) By far Chloe is the most enjoyable of the three and all time spent with her is very rewarding.



I am a fairly new ham, having become a Technician in early 2010, and then upgrading to Extra Class about a month later. Having a BSEE helped with the studying needed! Although I'm relatively new, I've been interested in ham radio for many years; my father was in the radio TV repair business and got me interested when I was quite young. I built a Lafayette Radio KT-200 shortwave receiver kit and became an SWL in the late 1950's.

Even though I started late in this hobby, I've jumped in enthusiastically to make up for lost time: my ham radio activities so far include participation in Army MARS for about fifty hours a month, checking into 3905 Century Club nets several evenings a week, involvement with Prince William ARES, and, of course, with the OVH for which I've just been elected to serve as Vice President.

Some of my other ham activities during

the past five months also include being assigned as the operator at a particular mile marker during the Marine Corps Marathon on 28 October, serving as NCS for six MARS nets during Hurricane Sandy for the period 29-30 October, helping at the Mini Tri It on 11 November, and assisting with the Manassas Christmas parade on 1 December and the Manassas Park Light parade on 8 December, getting my ARRL VE credentials in January, and attending both Frostfest in Richmond and Winterfest in Annandale during February.

The most extensive recent home project was buying a portable generator big enough to power the whole house - except, unfortunately, for the electric furnace (45 kW needed if the heat pump can't provide enough heat). That project included getting a 200 amp manual transfer switch complete with watt meters put in. We have been really stuck when electricity has gone out for several days at a time due to heavy snow and high winds because we have a well and septic system - hopefully no more! It's also nice to have lights when the rest of the neighborhood is dark. Next I plan to expand the portable power to the detached garage via a couple of small transfer switches.

In addition to serving as the OVH vice president in 2013, I plan to repeat most of the events listed earlier and also provide assistance at the 50 Mile Bull Run Run, at the Mini Tri runs, and at the OVH Hamfest and Field Day in June. Most of these endeavors will continue to improve my skills as a ham radio operator, I hope.

Some Possibly Useful / Interesting Information

- 1. Is there an Amateur Radio channel on Television? Yes! Really? This is true and you can check it out right now if you get (some of) your TV channels via Internet using Roku (roku.com). Amateurlogic.tv which we've mentioned here previously is now available 24/7 as one of Roku's Science and Technology channels.
- 2. The BBC has an excellent five part series of YouTube videos on How to Build a Satellite. Basic stuff, but with lots of good technical, behind the scenes, footage. Check out http://tinyurl.com/HowToBuildASatelliteSeries
- 3. Everyone (?) has heard of the uberStation, super Contest Station, W3LPL, located in Maryland somewhere between Washington and Baltimore. Want to take a video tour? Go to: http://tinyurl.com/W3LPL-OpenHouseTour
- 4. Gary Pearce KN4AQ a professional videographer continues to produce excellent videos which document ham radio activites, including conference and hamfests. Check out http://arvideonews.com/hrn/
- 5. Too cheap to buy the latest (22nd) version of the ARRL's Antenna Handbook? You can get some of its content and supplements for free at http://www.arrl.org/arrl-antenna-book-reference
- 6 iPad users: like to do transmission line and impedance matching calculations by hand or with the help of a calculator? Do you remember how? At last there a good graphical SMITH CHART calculator is available for the iPad. Go to http://microwavemac.com for more info. A bargain at \$4.99, this iPad app seems to do everything that the ARRL's no longer supported, but excellent \$50 DOS based MicroSmith program did.
- 7. iPad/VHF/UHF repeater users who travel: like to fumble around trying to read the fine print in a recent version of the "thick wallet sized" ARRL Repeater Directory to find local repeater(s)? iPad apps to the the rescue: RepeaterBook (free) automatically calculates your 6 place Grid Location (using GPS data) and gives the essential data on the nearby repeaters. Repeaters (\$4.99) shows a map with your location (from GPS) and the approximate locations and data for nearby repeaters, and you can change the location. Although each can use improvement, each works well now, and you can get the data very fast when you need it! Now just keep/use the ARRL Repeater Directory as a backup reference.

W4OVH.NET - OVH Web Site Developments - Update

- 1. In February, John / KG4NXT showed his programming knowledge and expertise and willingness to assist by providing some excellent suggestions and ideas to simplify the coding required for conversion of the OVH web site from its obsolete frame based structure to a non-frame based web site. John's suggestions are being implemented with some modifications, and will facilitate completion of that work which, unfortunately, still requires a lot (several days) of manual work. Expected completion: mid-May.
- 2. Another OVH web site related project has been the making available to all OVH members on a OVH "Members Only" web page of up-to-date PDF files with detailed contact information and dues status for all OVH members, collated (indexed) by member FirstName, by CallSign and by LastName. The reasons for this are clear. For many years, the publicly accessible portions of the OVH web site has contained a limited listing of member information: call sign, first name, license class and email only. This public listing does not contain member telephone numbers or dues status information because many members do not wish to have such information posted on a publicly accessible web site for privacy reasons. Most hams (including OVH members) know and refer to their fellow hams by first name or call sign primarily, but the limited public listing has been collated by last name which effectively scrambles the information and makes it difficult to use to quickly find an email address even when a first name or call sign is accurately recalled. Years ago, full listings of membership information were printed and then mailed out to all members; those printouts were lengthy due to printing and formatting limitations; since then the postal mailing expenses for large printouts (and just about anything else for that matter) have become much more expensive. Fortunately, by now, almost everyone concerned knows how to access a web site to get data online; in fact, that is preferred by many as long as the online data source is available reliably and simple to access. These were the reasons for this project.

One of the main stumbling blocks to in accomplishing this task has been that fact that the underlying OVH database is maintained by the OVH Data Base Maintainer (Art / W1CRO) who must keep that information updated for general club purposes with irregular inputs each month from the OVH Treasurer, the OVH Membership Chairman, and also from members whose information changes. Maintaining the master database is a lot of work by itself. But at last, procedures are now in place to complete this project very shortly. An OVH "Members Only" web page at W4OVH.NET is now referred to by a clickable URL on the publicly accessible OVH Club Members web page. To get past the authentication page to access the listings available on that "Members Only" web page, however, one needs to know and use a username and a password to log in. The required username/password has to date only been given out only for testing purposes. It will be provided to all members with paid up OVH dues shortly after the March 18th OVH meeting. Be sure to make note of that username/password information when you receive it for it will remain valid until next year. We think you will find this new resource to be very helpful! It will be demonstrated at the March 18th meeting if requested. Once this is fully operational, the OVH Data Base Maintainer has agreed to be responsible for keeping current PDF files of the OVH member data uploaded to the "Members Only" web page at W4OVH.NET.

3. The converted non-frames structured web site for W4OVH.NET, will provide a new OVH Members' URLs web page with hyperlinks to OVH member web pages. Each OVH members who already has a personal web site and wants it listed there will need to provide the URL (via email) and request that it be included in that listing. The expanded W4OVH.NET web site will also be able to provide a number of publicly accessible web pages at W4OVH.NET for use by OVH members; OVH members provided such access will be able to personalize and control the content directly. Once particular members get their customized web pages into a presentable form, the URLs for them will be also be listed on the public OVH Members' URLs web page. Guidelines will be established for the allowable content (e.g., ham radio related) on these OVH member web pages hosted at W4OVH.NET, as well as usage restrictions, and OVH members who request such access will need to demonstrate basic knowledge of how to create basic web pages, a useful skill. More information will be provided and perhaps even a tutorial session. This is not a new idea; some other clubs do this already. The German equivalent of the ARRL, the DARC, provides such a facility for its members, and currently hosts approximately 4,000 member web sites online at http://www.mydarc.de/url.shtml Most of the sites there are in German, but many of those also have English language versions; although some of those web sites are very basic, others are quite elaborate.
