Club President Wayne N7QLK, called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm in the main conference at the Manassas Public Works building.

After the Pledge of Allegiance, all present stated their names and call signs. There were thirty-one OVH members and five guests in attendance.

Presentation: Gordon Miller / NQ4K of the Sterling Park Amateur Radio Club, sponsor of the annual Virginia QSO party, gave a presentation on the Virginia QSO Party which will take place in March. Also, if you participate, be sure to indicate your club affiliation.

VP's Corner - Jeff Fuller WB6UIE


I'm honored to have been elected OVH's Vice President and I look forward to working with you and the other officers and directors in club activities and in the recruiting of new members.

Like many of us, my interest in ham radio began when I was a youngster. In my case, that was over fifty years ago in junior high school. After passing our Novice exams which included a 5 wpm Morse code test, a couple of us pooled our very limited funds and managed to buy a World War II surplus ARC-5 receiver and enough parts to assemble a power supply and a 6L6 (vacuum tube) crystal oscillator. The total cost for these items was probably under \$20

but that was a lot of money back then. I can still remember the smell of the solder melting as we carefully added each component. Antenna? Well, that was sort of a long wire - made from as much lamp cord as we could afford from Sears at four cents a foot. We considered the lamp cord a good deal because it easily split down the middle and we get twice the original length by connecting the two ends together. But most of all, I remember the thrill of my very first contact using Morse Code. All the way from California to Idaho on 40 meters using equipment I'd helped build. What excitement.


Several years later I envisioned plans for college and work in what would eventually become Silicon Valley. Uncle Sam, however, changed them with the best recruiting ad I'd ever seen. It was right on the front page of the newspaper and consisted of my birthday with the number eleven next to it. That led to a career in the military, followed by a return to school on the GI Bill and a second career in the wireless industry. There were many rewarding experiences, but not much time for ham radio.

So ... here I am in my second childhood (retirement) and enjoying a return to ham radio. In some ways, I feel a bit like a mole poking his head out into the sunlight for the first time. Where did all the World War II surplus stuff go and what are these funky things linking repeaters via the Internet? It's been a steep learning curve at times, but never fear - I'm trainable (at least that's what WiFE says). I look forward to working with each of you in club activities as well as recruiting new hams and helping them share the same excitement we all felt when we made our first contact.



Two Meter FM Aeronautical Mobile Operations on February 24, 2017

On February 24, 2017 afternoon, Byron / AK4XR, a non-current private pilot, took up an offer from Paul / W4ZB to go flying in a P210N aircraft and operate aeronautical mobile on 2 meters FM while aloft. The flight was flown as a round robin from KHEF (Manassas Airport) up to KACY (Atlantic City) and then return by a slightly more southerly routing, most of the enroute phases was flown at an altitudes of 6,500 or 7,500 feet.



Because the line of sight range was nearly 100 miles even at those relatively low altitudes, no problems making contacts were expected. Connectors and cables were used so that the antenna input/output on Byron's handheld 2 Meter FM transceiver could be connected directly to one of the aircraft's external VHF comm antennas, but would otherwise be independent of the aircraft electrical and electronic systems. The basic plan was

to make calls to 2 M repeaters along the general route to make contacts; to help do that, a list of repeaters with frequencies and PL tone codes was compiled and pre-programmed into Bryon's transceiver, power output set to 5 watts.



Right after the departure from KHEF, Byron was so preoccupied and focused observing airplane / flight matters (as a previously active pilot) that he did not make any radio calls. However, after a short while at 150 knots (175



mph) as we were climbing out over the Maryland eastern shore, Byron began calling and bringing up repeaters, but he was unable to contact anyone through a repeater. A short while later as we were crossing into Delaware he decided to call CQ on the 146.52 MHz FM calling frequency. A very different result! After a few calls, Byron suddenly had a big grin: a bunch of different stations were all calling back to him at the same time. He was advising callers his position was at 7,500 feet up in the air but he didn't quite know where he was above the cloud deck. [Several panel instruments and displays gave the precise position.] I told him to look out his window, straight down, because - on his first contact - we were right over Dover AFB and part of its runway could be seen below through a break in the clouds. Over the next 40 minutes or so, Bryon made about 15 more contacts with stations in Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Maryland. By then we had turned around and were headed back towards Manassas. The experience was somewhat like being a rare HF dx station on the receiving end of a pile-up!

Next time: better planning; use pile-up handling to spread the callers out, systematic logging with position at QSO time (a logger to help?); also try 2M SSB and 432 SSB / FM. With some practice, we could try for a new VA QSO Party mobile record in 2018: radio operating on flight routes up to 23000 feet above, but traversing most VA cities/counties during flights up to 9 hours each.



Web Site Improvement Committee Work Update And Details

The February 2017 OVH Newsletter (at page 7) contains a short article about the work of the OVH's Web Site Improvement Committee. The article provides references to historical material about the OVH's web site for full context and also requested that all OVH members who intended to be or thought they might be future content providers for the OVH's web site(s) to please identify themselves and provide related information about future content which they might be able to provide. Because the subject of web site improvement, with the possible inclusion of links for "social media" has been of interest to the membership generally at regular OVH meetings, the article advised that all incoming correspondence from prospective content providers would be posted on the Members Only web page at W4OVH.NET and would be considered by the web site improvement working group before it next meeting before the upcoming March 2017 OVH regular meeting.

If you have looked at the Members Only web page recently (this is being written on 3/16/2017), you have noticed that no such correspondence has been posted there from any OVH member who has identified himself / herself as a future content provider for the OVH's web site or Internet presence. Why is that? Simply put, no one at all has sent anything in. Is this merely a "getting pen to paper problem" for truly interested members who really will be future content providers or its that wishful thinking? Can't tell, but the fact that no one at all has been able yet to send anything in certainly raises a note of caution for the web site improvement working group. Improvement of the OVH's web site and Internet presence will require both reorganization of the existing content as well as new quality content and consistent updating of content - which is are completely separate issues from the overall "appearance" of the web pages; a superficial appearances will not make up for the presence of poorly organized or out of date content. There is already a lot of good content about the club on the web site but one must dig somewhat to find it. The organization / reorganization issues for the content could be fixed simply with a better menu and index structure, But what about the "new content" itself - where will that come from if not from the members? Answer: the same sources that have been providing it as explained in February's OVH Newsletter.

I encourage all OVH members who have more than a passing interest in the work of the web site improvement working group to look at the Members Only web page - which as of today - has a new hyperlink to some of the working materials / documents of that group to date. There is a lot of content there and a lot of questions and issues are in flux - a further update and report will be forthcoming at the OVH regular meeting on March 20th.

Did Someone Steal Our Name? Has the OVH Been Around Longer Than Them?
