Some Possibly Interesting or Useful Information

- 1. For those not familiar, the annual Field Day event during the last weekend each June has been sponsored and promoted by the ARRL for many, many years. Basic info can be found at http://www.arrl.org/field-day and a PDF file at http://www.arrl.org/files/file/Field-Day/2014/Field%20Day%20Packet%202014%20v2.pdf Look for more about the OVH's participation in Field Day this year in the May and June OVH's Newsletters.
- 3. Microsoft support for Windows XP has now terminated, preceded by considerable discussion on the OVH email reflector. For many still using XP, the predictions of immediate problems, if not very quick disasters, have proved to be like the Y2K predictions which preceded 1/1/2000 when virtually nothing happened. XP is very robust but with flaws; those who have been using XP carefully for many years without infections from Internet sources will likely be able to continue to do so for many more years.
- 4. Radio Propagation site. Mentioned here before is the excellent web site by K9LA http://k9la.us which has many papers and discussions of technical topics relating to HF radio propagation. This guy knows his stuff and can put it into understandable text.
- 5. Microsoft Interface Changes. Bill / N3SV recently posted an excellent write up about "negative" tiled interface concerns with Windows 8 which has been kept some computer users from transitioning to that so-called "improved" operating system interface. People often resist change for things that already work well and the supposed "improved" change item offers no clear advantage or only obvious disadvantages. Bill suggested installing "Classic Start" available from http://ninite.com to obtain a Windows 7 (and Windows XP) type "Start Button" interface. Other startup interface replacements for Windows 8 can be found by searching on Google. Microsoft's insistence on forcing unwanted interface changes has not been confined to its operating systems but has been going on with its widely used Microsoft Office Suite since 2007. The so-called"improved" Ribbon interface of Microsoft Office 2007, 2010 and later version causes the loss of a significant amount of vertical screen editing space and requires increased use of (time and motion wasting) mouse movements (rather than just keystrokes) for skilled Office users, while adding new "features" of limited or no real value over Office 2003 which can still be installed on post-XP operating systems. If you are stuck with a machine which has Office 2007 or later installed and want to get back to an Office 2003 type interface, you should consider the low cost products available at http://addintools.com

- 8. Ham Station improvement and ergonomic design. A web site maintained by N3RR of Rockville, Maryland has a lot of interesting, well written information on this subject: http://users.erols.com/n3rr
- 9. ARRL's 100 Year Anniversary. 2014 is the 100th year anniversary of the ARRL which was founded in 1914. Your writer who was first licensed in 1961 well remembers the ARRL's big 50th year anniversary in 1964 when the massive improvements in the radio art over the previous 50 years were discussed, along with the many contributions to those advancements made by hams. Back in the very early 1960's, as now, a ham organization known as the Old Old Timers Club (http://ootc.us) existed for bona fide "old old timers." To join the OOTC (then as now), one had to have been a [licensed] radio operator for at least 40 years. In the early 1960's that meant that OOTC members had been licensed in the early 1920's or earlier; many of them your writer remembers talking to back then had operated in the Spark Gap transmitter era (ham use of spark gap transmitters caused too much interference and were banned by the early 1920's) and could talk about World War I as though it had just ended. Time flys by.
