Some Possibly Interesting / Useful Information

- 1. NOVEC, the Electric Co-Op which provides electric service in much of Prince William County, has recently been sending out flyers advertising the availability of a new Internet service for its customers. Is this offering another BPL system? Nope, it's a satellite based system see, novecnet.com for more details.
- 2. "Green" electric powered airplanes? A group based in Switzerland has produced an experimental airplane covered with solar cells which is intended to make a non-stop around the world flight. Its wingspan is wider than a 747's., but it can barely carry two individuals. It flies at very low speed. It is currently making its way across the USA on test flights. An interesting demo project [solarimpulse.com], but not very practical and it seems to be getting quite a bit of "assistance" from the US government despite the sequester. Wonder who is paying for it?
- 3. New, very small, custom programmable, and very low cost computers are attracting the interest of ham radio and electronics experimenters. The tiny Raspberry Pi device runs Linux variants and essentially has the capability of a laptop. The tiny Arduino computer board system has less "power", but is much easier to adapt to software control of hardware devices adn add-ons. Karl Berger / W4KRL described both the hardware and software aspects of an Arduino project he is working on at the May9th AMRAD meeting: a touch screen controller for a miniVNA (Vector Network Analyzer) for ham antenna adjustment. Karl's system is almost working. Karl provided an excellent list of Arduino related hardware and software references and sources, a copy of which is on the next page.
