


A Few Of The Attendees At The July 2010 OVH Meeting Before It Started

The SMITH Chart Revisited / Updated With Some Reminiscences

Your editor still recalls as a would be Novice licensee in 1960 observing his tutor and examiner for that exam (Howard / W1DG - SK since the 1970's) avidly reading one of the early QST articles about how to use the Smith Chart, a nomograph for solving antenna and transmission line matching problems, among others, using preprinted paper Smith Charts. I still remember back then thinking that if that was so interesting for him, it might be worth learning about.

Howard lived a 1/4 mile away, was the father of one of my school friends, a Georgia Tech graduate, WWII naval officer and a senior engineer working for Radio Free Europe. He was a active ham radio operator at the time with a somewhat dated station. His receiver was a National HRO-60 which, while very sensitive, used a pre-WWII design in which bands were changed by physically changing sets of coils. His transmitter was a B&W 5100, which had a distinctive appearance which I had seen and recognized in newsreels a few years earlier in use in Fidel Castro's camp when his revolutionaries were still in the mountains in Cuba. His B&W transmitter fed an array of coils and variable capacitors which fed a wide 600 ohm line which ran out to feed-through insulators in a basement window to a further outdoor 600 ohm transmission line feeding a large (nearly 3/4 acre) fixed wire antenna array electrically pointed toward Europe. Every weekend W1DG worked schedules on AM HF with colleagues in Germany and Portugal, and almost always made his contacts.

As common as antenna and transmission line matching problems are, the mathematics needed to solve them discretely or in closed form are neither simple nor particularly intuitive except in simple or specialized cases. QST (and QEX) over the years have had many articles about the Smith Chart and you should check out the technical search facility at the ARRL's web site. The first computerized Smith Chart program which I found intuitive and effective was the DOS MSMITH program distributed by the ARRL, but now discontinued, although MSMITH still runs well on DOS emulators. A new freeware Smith Chart program known as Quicksmith which runs on Windows XP+ has now become available and is the subject of a current series in QEX: see Using Quicksmith - Part 1: July/August 2010 QEX at pages 26-33. Worth checking out! Quicksmith can be downloaded with documentation at http://nathaniyer.com



Does this look a little like one of the workstations of George / K4GVT? It is a bit neater, but otherwise not too suprising if it does for it belongs to George's son, Chris / N2JTA, at his firm, FlyLogic in Vista, California.

Chris was written up in MIT's Technology Review for July / August 2010 which described how Chris used this workstation to "open" a protected, secured integrated circuit chip to examine and determine the exact security codes embedded within the chip structure. "It takes a significant effort to crack the chips, as Christopher Tarnovsky, a former U.S. Army computer security specialist, demonstrated in February. By dissolving the chip's outer casing with acid, removing a protective inner mesh with rust remover, and tapping the communications channels with tiny needles, Tarnovsky was able to force a module to release its secret information. Such an attack might let someone who had stolen a laptop unlock remote websites or pose as the laptop's owner, but fortunately, it would be impractical to do this on a large scale."
