

Announcement of new D-Star Repeater Availability - September 7, 2009








Where is lightning most likely to strike in the USA?

Help With Repeater RF Troubleshooting at the Mt. Pone Site - September 14, 2009

FLASH: Folks, the Engineering / Technical Committee needs your help right now!

We have temporarily placed and activated an analog repeater at Mt. Pone in lieu of the D-Star repeater (which is still there, but temporarily off-line). This is for test reasons and we need your signal reports. If you have 440 FM capability, please program 442.5125 + offset with CTCSS of 100hz. We would like to get reports of signal strength from users from all over the area. Most important is signal consistence as we believe we are chasing some type of intermittent problem relating to the antenna or feed line. Your reports of repeater status and signal strength will be most valuable. After a few days, we should be able to determine whether the problems we have been experiencing are D-Star equipment related or antenna system / RF issues. Please report to Keith / KM4AA or George K4GVT. Intermittent problems are the most difficult to isolate and your help is needed and will be most appreciated.

BUY NOW hype - low price D-Star radios - recently on the OVH email reflector!

George / K4GVT: Check out the prices for the ID-800H-\$379.00 and the ID-91AD-\$369.00 at the web site of gigaparts.com. The proprietor there orders these units from Icom directly and carries no stock at his store. Currently: \$100 instant rebate and \$20 mail-in rebate. These prices / rebates expire 09/30/2009 so hurry and get yours the prices are very good on both of these.

Bill / N4SV: Wow!, that is a great price on the ID-800H, George. As an owner of one of them I can say it is a great dual band mobile or home-use radio, even if you used it only for analog repeaters. But the big advantage is that it also does DSTAR OUT OF THE BOX, no additional modules to buy. It has a nice compact size (identical form factor to the Icom ID-208H), small remote head, but still has about the largest font size on the display of just about any mobile radio I've seen...great for those of us who might have a bit of a problem seeing those smaller displays on other radios. Thanks for the heads up on this George, it would be great to see a lot of club members take advantage of this price discount.

George / K4GVT: Bill, I ordered a second unit for experimenting with D-star remote links.



An expensive D-Star radio from ICOM - not yet available in the USA!

The ICOM-9100, now available in Japan, operates on all HF bands as well as the 50 MHz, 144 MHz and 432 MHz out of the box. A plug-in D-Star module is available as is a plug-in RF module for operation on 1.2 GHz.
