

## PRESIDENT'S LETTER:

Greetings to all. As Keith / KM4AA announced at the last meeting, the OVH has at last received good news regarding the 2M D-Star allocation: T-MARC has assigned a 2M frequency for the OVH. Any 2M allocations in this area are extremely hard to get and we should consider ourselves very fortunate to receive this allocation. Extra thanks to Keith / KM4AA who has been pursuing this diligently on OVH's behalf for a lengthy period of time. You will recall that at the January, 2010 OVH meeting the membership voted to acquire a 2 meter D-Star repeater to complement the 440 Mhz D-Star repeater, knowing that it was uncertain when a 2M allocation might become available.



The Board of Directors kept has funding for this project available in the 2011 budget, but that funding amount was just recently was redirected towards the antenna work needed for the FM repeaters on the NOVEC tower, more below. This does not pose a problem, although it may delay purchase of the 2M D-Star repeater slight, with a reallocation of the funding in the 2012 budget. This 2M D-Star repeater will go on Mt. Pone tank / tower location next to the 440 Mhz D-Star and will provide very nice coverage that I expect will be beyond the current 2M FM coverage. This is the better location which provides clear line of sight for considerably distances in almost all directions. I am very excited about this and looking forward to its implementation. Meanwhile, the expected NOVEC tower work with the replacement antennas for the FM repeaters is at the mercy of the NOVEC contractor whose crews are tied up out working on very large projects of the area. We could have them come back early to do the work if the need for it became critical, but only for a substantially higher hourly rate. This does not seem justified as the existing FM repeater antennas are still working, although not as well a the replacements will work. I will keep all informed.

The Holidays are fast approaching, some ideas regarding the OVH Christmas party have been thrown around, but we will need to lock this down quickly before we miss opportunities for a venue. Expect this to be on the agenda at the upcoming meeting on October 17th.

# Minutes of the Ole Virginia Hams Amateur Radio Club Meeting September 19, 2011:

George K4GVT called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Meeting was held at the Prince William County Red Cross Chapter House in Manassas, Virginia.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, all present stated their names and call signs. There were 21 OVH members and 6 visitors.

Program – Terry / WA5NTI who is one of our newer members (but a ham for many years) gave presented a program on the new RigExpert Antenna Analyzer model AA-54 which covers 0.1 to 54 MHz that he recently purchased; Terry has been to several members homes to hook this up to the antennas and feedline, obtain readouts on a laptop and interpret the results. He has offered to help other club members as needed; Art / W1CRO has used it at his QTH and presented a Powerpoint slide report on the antennas at his QTH.

#### **BUSINESS MEETING**

Minutes from the August meeting were approved as read.

Treasurer's Report by Gary / WG4ARC, computer was down and he couldn't print out the report.

Membership – Theresa / KG4TVM, as acting membership chairperson, read in Emmett Greenleaf who is working on getting his old call sign back. Jim Stocks / KK4CWO, Lisa Bryant (no callsign yet!) and Steve Hailey / KI4FQD were all voted in. Theresa asked for club members to volunteer chairing this committee.

ARES – Steve / N4OGR reminded us about the Marine Corp Marathon will be on Sunday, October 30th this year. If you want to volunteer, you need to do so soon because you will required to attend two training meetings.

Scholarship – Art / W1CRO brought boxes of magazines and other ham related items to the meeting, club members are welcome to them, please make a donation to the scholarship fund if there is something you want.

## Some Possibly Useful Items of Information / Thoughts


- 1. Terrain Profiles using the HFTA program. This program and how to use it to create antenna / propagation terrain profiles has been described in recent versions of the ARRL's Antenna Handbook. - 3. Computer / Telephone Hackers and Ham Radio. A supposed infamous computer / telephone hacker and Federal fugitive from the 1990's who ultimately served years in a Federal Lock Up has written another book which was recently featured on BookTV ( www.booktv.org) which appears on a CSPAN channel on weekends. The latest book is "Ghosts in the Wires: My Adventures as the World's Most Wanted Hacker" by Kevin Mitnick. Turns out Kevin is also a long time ham radio operator who is currently licensed according to QRZ.com and the FCC's database. He is now thoroughly rehabilitated and operates as a white-hat hacker and expert on computer and telephone security who has testified before Congress on those subjects. The book describes his use of modified ham radio equipment as part of his hacking toolkit as well as "what really happened" in many of his misreported escapades. The fact that the statutes of limitations have run out allow for a "tell all." Interesting and captivating read, but be forewarned, his experiences described could make anyone become very concerned (paranoid) about the abilities of Federal prosecutors to go after someone (anyone) with a steam-roller. ## Talk / Presentation by Terry / WA5NTI and Arthur / W1CRO at the September, 2011 OVH Meeting


Terry/WA5NTI recently acquired a RigExpert Antenna Analyzer model AA-54 which covers 0.1 to 54 MHz; as with many new electronic 'toys" he could not resist using it and helping others with it. The device is used to characterize and tune antennas and feedline systems. The AA-54 Analyzer is useful for tuning single or multi element/multi band antenna to resonance (SWR measurement for 50 and 75-Ohm systems), comparing characteristics of an antenna before and after specific events (rain, hurricane, etc.), making coaxial stubs or measuring their parameters, cable fault location, and for measuring capacitance or inductance of reactive loads as a preliminary step to lumped or variable feedline tuning devices. The AA-54 Analyzer is battery operated with internal memory and a readout, but also can be connected to a PC via USB cable. It can be used as standalone device or through a PC which can be used to dump accumulated measurement data to a spreadsheet. As a result, it can be used at the antenna (e.g. at the top of a tower) or inside the shack at the coax end of the system. 


Analyzer Plot for W1CRO 40 meter dipole complex impedance showing "R", "Z" and "X"




Analyzer Plot for W1CRO 40 meter dipole showing VSWR with point selected at 7200 kHz for details
