Although VEC's are still able to administer FCC examinations during the shutdown, the partial shutdown of the FCC itself means the FCC is not currently accepting any paperwork or electronic filings - so



for the time being no new ham radio operator or station licenses are being issued. Also, to my knowledge, the FCC is not currently accepting applications for vanity call signs. Regardless, we as operators need to remain ready for whatever happens and do so in a way that keeps us and those we care about safe.

I also know that a number of the OVH's members who work for the U.S. government or for contractors for the U.S. government are adversely affected by the shutdown due to furloughs and other uncertainties. Hopefully, this all will be over soon.

I would also like to apologize to the members for not being able to attend the last two OVH meetings due to my being very, very busy. I want to thank Clarence / K4CNM for doing a fine job filling in and for keeping things running in my absence.

I hope all can attend the upcoming OVH meeting on Monday, October 21th at 7:30 PM, and I look forward to seeing you there!

Clarence / K4CNM, OVH Vice President, called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Meeting was held at the Prince William County Red Cross Chapter House in Manassas, Virginia. OVH President, Justin / KJ4LAS was not able to attend.

All present stated their names and call signs: 35 OVH members and 2 guests attended.

BUSINESS MEETING

Minutes from the August meeting were approved with the following change to the paragraph for New Business, it should have read that John Nagel is with Prince William County Police Department (not the Sheriff's Department); minutes were approved as amended.

Treasurer's report – Terry / KC4DV gave the report; motion by John / KG4NXT, seconded by Charlie / WA4YGI approved as presented; Butch / W4HJL reported that Art / W1CRO has reviewed the budget and \$16,000 is the maximum available for the any antenna work.

Information / Notes about the OVH Web Site - W4OVH.NET

- 1. Additional materials from the September 16, 2013 OVH meeting relating to several possible scenarios for OVH FM Repeater Antenna improvement / refurbishing and roughly estimated costs for each scenario were added to the "Members Only" web page. This information is accessible through the "Members Only" link at the top of the "Club Members" web page which reached by clicking on the "Club Members" tab at W4OVH.NET.
- 2. The "Members Only" OVH Club membership rosters were updated as of September 27, 2013. Go there for the most up-to-date and complete information on the current OVH members and how to contact each. The three rosters are collated by LastName, CallSign and FirstName to make finding anyone very easy.
- 3. Searching for specific content text or pictures on the W4OVH.NET web site. A question has been raised whether it is possible to search for specific text or image content on the OVH web site. The answer is Yes this can be done using facilities at Google.com (and probably also at Bing.com). Here's how to do it with Google:

Text Search using http://google.com
put into the search text box there the specific text to be
searched followed by a space followed by site:w4ovh.net

Text Search Example: Dayton site:w4ovh.net

Image Search using http://google.com/imghp put into the search box there descriptive text for the image to be searched followed by a space followed by site:w4ovh.net

Image Search Example: field day site:w4ovh.net

How does this work? Google periodically, weekly or more often, searches through all public hyperlinks at W4OVH.NET and then builds (or rebuilds) an updated index of the text and images retrieved. When using Google to search for text or image content, the use of the search limiter "site:w4ovh.net" (as shown above) limits and restricts Google's search only to content obtained at or indexed from the W4OVH.NET web site. Google determines image content either from text data which appears in an image (and which has been analyzed by OCR) or by words (e.g., those likely to be a caption for or descriptive of the content) which appear on a web page near a particular image. These techniques work very well to locate specific content at W4OVH.NET. Try them!

4. OVH FM Repeater Coverage Map based upon the April, 2013 field measurement. Clarence / K4CNM led the effort in April, 2013 to compile usability information on OVH's 146.97 and 442.20 FM Repeaters, and then prepared a color map showing repeater coverage at various measurement points. Two different resolution versions that large map are available in PDF format on the "Members Only" web page. A somewhat lower resolution map which is resizable, zoomable and scrollable appears on the Repeaters web page accessible through the "Repeaters" link at W4OVH.NET.

Some Possibly Useful or Interesting Information

1. Wayne Green / W2NSD, very much an entrepreneur and ardent supporter of ham radio, died last month in his 90's. He was a former editor of CQ Magazine for several years in the late 1950's but will best be remembered by older hams as the publisher of "73 Magazine" from 1960 to about 2003. He always had strong editorial opinions and was a strong writer who would write editorials which went on and on and sometimes seemed like rants. However, his opinions and prognostications about ham radio often proved to be correct.

Some will remember that Wayne Green was such a strong supporter of the late Senator Barry Goldwater / K7UGA in the 1964 Presidential Election that a memorable 73 Magazine cover shortly continued on following page

before that election had a picture of the White House with a large HF triband antenna on its roof and a large caption reading: "A Ham in the White House?" That election, however, was won by President Lyndon Johnson who was reelected after the mainstream media press attacked Senator Goldwater as a warmonger with misquotes about possible use of nuclear weapons against North Vietnam. A very different time.

After publication of 73 Magazine ceased, Wayne Green put all of the issues (about 518 total) into the public domain; today they be found and downloaded for free at archive.org [http://archive.org/details/73-magazine]. This is a lot of interesting reading, much of which is still pertinent today! Your OVH Newsletter editor wrote and submitted an technical article to 73 Magazine in the early 1960's which was accepted and later published and for which he received \$80 - quite a while ago when \$80 was worth a lot more than it is today.

- 2. Once you upgrade your ham license to General or Extra Class, you access to all of the HF ham bands, large portions of which are still only available for CW (Morse Code) and other digital modes. Although variations of CW have been around for more than 150 years and CW is still widely used on the HF ham bands, demonstrated proficiency in CW is no longer a requirement for a ham radio license. If you are interested in learning, however, check out the free CW training programs available at http://lcwo.net/ and http://g4fon.net/ It is possible to teach yourself this basic skill in 15 to 30 hours of time spread out over several weeks; it's not really that difficult if you can find the time and once you learn the basics, your skill level will increase rapidly with on the air use.
- 3. Do you have a favorite text editor? Think you know all about text editors? Check out texteditors.org before you try to answer this question. This site provides information about hundred (maybe thousands) of text editors.
- 4. At the July 2013 OVH meeting, Terry / WA5NTI gave a presentation about JT65A mode; Joe Taylor / K1JT, the software author (and a Nobel laureate) recently created a presentation about his related WSJT mode software and how that can be used. Go to http://physics.princeton.edu/pulsar/K1JT/W9DXCC_2013_K1JT.pptx to see K1JT's Powerpoint slides for his recent presentation.
- 5. All hams are interested in Antennas and develop various levels of expertise in dealing with Antennas if they construct a station and are active radio operators. Fortunately, there is wealth of technical, practical and "how to do it" literature available in printed form as well as on the web.

Impedance matching is always an issue with an antenna system and an understanding of impedance matching becomes important once one goes beyond replicating simple and well known designs. For many years Smith Chart techniques have facilitated impedance matching calculations and design. Some interesting and helpful information on that topic is available at http://www.antenna-theory.com/tutorial/smith/chart.php This particular web site also has other useful information [http://www.antenna-theory.com].

Grounding systems and arrangements are also important for most Antenna systems and radio shacks [i.e., station operating rooms]. Poor grounding arrangements can result in "hot shacks" [RF radiation in the shack], inefficient operation due to power losses, and increased lightning strike hazards as well as other conditions. A lot of helpful information on these topics are available at http://www.w8ji.com/station_ground.htm This particular web site [http://www.w8ji.com] also has a large amount of other useful information on ham radio topics.

6. The Vienna, Austria based Documentary Archives for Radio Communications [http://dokufunk.org] which has been mentioned here before continues to increase its collections of amateur radio related materials, many of which are available online. The site is in English (and German), and includes a substantial ham radio collections including large QSL card collections and videos; most recently http://dokufunk.org has added Powerpoint slides and other recordings from many of the presentations at the 2013 Friedrichschafen Ham Radio Convention; that is the largest annual Hamfest in Europe and just slightly smaller (in attendance each year) than the annual Dayton Hamvention. New at the web site and particularly interesting to look are the slides by Tom Perera / W1TP about the ENIGMA machine. W1TP has been an exhibitor at the Manassas Hamfest and is almost always at Dayton Hamvention. There is lots of other stuff to see too - definitely worth visiting. Enjoy!
