# PRESIDENT'S LETTER:

Hello to all and I hope this message finds you all healthy and well. It's already November and this past month has been a very busy one for OVH members in several different areas as you will see from the reports later in this newsletter.

For those interested in emergency communications, the recent Typhoon Haiyan in the Philippines has caused massive devastation and is likely to be the deadliest such storm in recorded history. Doubtlessly, local amateur radio operators there are playing a major role with emergency



communications. Please reflect on the massive upheaval that must be going on over there and keep an ear open for any health and welfare traffic that might need to be passed.

Another item I'd like to bring up is how we operate at meetings. The OVH uses the Robert's Rules of Order to facilitate our business which means once a motion is brought to the floor and seconded, it is up for debate and anyone may speak for or against the motion on the floor once recognized, but the discussion must be kept germane to the topic at hand and both the comments and any questions should be handled in a respectful manor. We haven't had any real issues with that but I'd just like to remind everyone.

In the case of complex or likely controversial matters to be brought up as motions, it is desirable that such motions to be carefully thought out and reduced to writing ahead of time and also run by other interested members before the meeting for comments, both positive and negative, and suggestions for improvement. The OVH is fortunate to have a membership with a very wide range of talents and capabilities, including some long term members who have a wealth of historical knowledge which can be drawn upon for invaluable insights. # Minutes of the Ole Virginia Hams Amateur Radio Club Meeting October 21, 2013:

Justin / KJ4LAS called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Meeting was held at the Prince William County Red Cross Chapter House in Manassas, Virginia.

All present stated their names and call signs. There were 30 OVH members and 3 guests.

Clarence / K4CNM gave an overview of the FM repeater antenna project, discussion followed, John / KG4NXT suggested we continue with committee reports and bring this back up after the break.

#### **BUSINESS MEETING**

Minutes from the September meeting were approved as read, motion by John / KG4NXT, seconded by Luther / KJ4FDK; Keith / KM4AA announced that the Technical Committee did meet as directed in the minutes; Justin / KJ4LAS announced that Keith / KM4AA is now the Technical Committee Chair.

Treasurer's report – Terry / KC4DV gave the report, motion by John / KG4NXT, seconded by Steve / N4OGRapproved as presented.

Membership – Luther / KJ4FDK presented the following application for vote: Steve Moore / WB0AOD, Luther made a motion to accept for membership, seconded by Steve N4OGR, approved; read in Derrick LaHousse – no call or license, but now KV4SH with an Extra Class license.

Repeaters – Keith / KM4AA reported that there was a problem with the server for D-Star but that everything is now back in order and working.

Training – Mark / WA4KFZ has 25 students in his ongoing Technician class and expects a big turnout for the VE Session later this month.

Hamfest – Terry / KC4DV advised that the next Hamfest Committee planning meeting will be held on November 6th at Panera on Liberia Avenue, Manassas at 7:00 pm.

Field Day – John / KG4NXT has volunteered to chair the June 2014 Field Day event; Butch / W4HJL has made the reservation for the event at the Nokesville Park.

Sunshine Corner – Theresa / KG4TVM announced the birthdays for the month, Joe / KI4OHR has been in a car accident, thanks to Scott / KB8NUM for running a very successful JOTA event.

JOTA – Scott / KB8NUM has volunteered to chair JOTA for 2014, had a great turnout this year at which two boy scouts were able to finish their merit badges.

4-H – Terry WA5NTI reported on the 4H project and had photos from the first two classes, Kristin / no callsign gave a report on what each class will cover and also thanked Terry / WA5NTI and Clarence / K4CNM for their assistance.

Old Business – Terry / WA5NTI asked about adding new members to the website, Clarence / K4CNM sends a traffic message on the NVTN once a new ham is voted in; Emmett / K2DJG attended Centreville Day and reported there were 80 vendors; Gavin / KK4MXT thinks we need to

be announced when we are in attendance at an event.

New Business – George / K4GVT announced that the Manassas Christmas Parade will be held on December 7th this year and the City of Manassas has requested the OVH's assistance; he needs at least 12 people to work the event; Art / W1CRO gave a description of the parade route; Theresa / KG4TVM announced that we will have a holiday party, details later; Terry / WA5NTI asked about new club badges.

#### BREAK

50/50 won by John / KG4NXT.

FM Repeater Antenna Project – Clarence / K4CNM reviewed his report from the last meeting which has been online on the members only page on the OVH web site since the September meeting and went over the various options. Motion by Clarence / K4CNM to replace all three FM repeater antennas on the NOVEC Tower at the same time with a cost not to exceed \$21,500, seconded by Keith KM4AA, lengthy discussion followed including other technical alternatives not yet considered, how the club could pay such amount given lesser limits on OVH funds potentially available, possibility of special assessments for club members to raise funds to pay for this project, possibility of OVH obtaining grant moneys given that the FM repeater capability service as an back up system for public emergencies, etc. After the discussion, when the motion finally came to a vote, the motion was defeated: 21 no, 4 yes.

George / K4GVT made a motion to switch the 146.97 FM repeater and the DSTAR repeater, but withdrew his motion after brief discussion; Art / W1CRO suggested trying to see if we could install a 2 meter FM remote receiver on Mt. Pone and to feed receive signals to the FM repeater at the NOVEC site to see if that would improve the coverage of the 2 meter FM repeater; George / K4GVT made a motion to temporarily link 146.97 FM receiver to a remote 2 meter FM receiver on Mt Pone and temporarily disable the 2 meter D-Star repeater on Mt. Pone for testing, seconded by Terry / WA5NTI, one opposed, approved.

Motion to adjourn by John / KG4NXT, seconded by Mark / WA4KFZ.

### Presentation on Ham Radio to First Lego League Group

On Sunday, October 20, 2013, Mark / WA4KFZ gave talk to a group of kids participating in the First Lego League Challenge about ham radio and emergency

communications. Mark was invited by an adult who was then taking Mark's Technician Class course along with his son.

The group's project is part of the First Lego League robotics competition and its theme this year is "Nature's Fury" and natural disasters. The group was interested in learning what ham radio could offer for providing communications capabilities in conjunction with a robot-controlled alerting system. Mark discussed the types of equipment hams use for

communications, i n c l u d i n g

in cluding

DSTAR and FM repeaters, satellites, and HF, the capabilities of such equipment and ham training for emergency communications. The kids asked Mark to evaluate their robotics project and offer his "expert" opinion as someone who works in the radio engineering field.

#### **Communications Help for the 2013 Marine Corp Marathon**

Several OVH members participated in providing communications services during the 2013 Marine Corps Marathon event on October 27, 2013.

Clarence / K4CNM and Gavin / KK4MXT provided a station at mile marker 23 on South Clark Street, a few hundred feet north of 23rd Street in Crystal City, Arlington, Virginia. They set up a battery operated portable station under a canopy using a dual band roll-up Slim Jim Antenna up about 20 feet. Most of the time HTs were used to contact net control, no runner incidents there this year.

Mark / WA4KFZ worked at the Medical 'A' tent (MED

space there was shared with Navy corpsmen and other military personnel who managed the runner's medical database. Medical

activity was rather quiet this year - apparently the good weather meant fewer runner incidents. The equipment used: Icom IC-91AD handheld (DSTAR digital voice mode) with Mirage BD-35 dual-band amplifier, 7AH battery, and a



homebrew dual-band J-pole antenna. All medical communications at the Marine Corp Marathon use either DSTAR voice or digital modes.

Terry / KC4DV participated from a location near the Pentagon.

### Some Possibly Useful or Interesting Information

- 1. Interested in learning about electronic circuit simulation? Try out one the free downloadable SPICE products. See, http://tinyURL.com/FreeSPICEsimulators and http://www.linear.com/designtools/software/#LTspice
- 2. Want to see a nearby mammoth ham radio HF antenna system in Loudoun County up close without any traveling? First use Google maps or bing.com maps in aerial and/or Bird's Eye view using coordinates: 39.1533, -77.6060 for the exact latitude / longitude of K4VV's station which is just northwest of downtown Leeesburg. Zoom in and out and study those views carefully. Next, look at the flyby video taken using a video camera carried on a minature helicopter posted at http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=D5hz\_xRCz4w Very impressive!
- 3. Looking to improve your Morse code proficiency with free software? First, try out Morse Runner which is downloadable from http://dxatlas.com Morse Runner is CW contest simulator. Next try RufzXP which is available at http://rufzxp.net The predecessor to RufzXP was a very popular German DOS program (Rufz) which was converted to run on XP and computers with later operatiing systems. If the name seems strange and you want to remember it, this might help: Rufzeichen means CallSign in German! The verb "rufen" (ruf) means to call similar to the sound that dogs make when they call out or bark! Practice with either of these propgrams is certain to improve your CW (Morse code) copy speed!
- 4. A new RTTY (Radio Teletype) program? HF RTTY has been popular with hams since the 1950's but has been software based for many years very few mechanical Teletype machines are still in use. Many excellent program are available, but check out a new one from G2YYD at http://www.rttycontesting.com/downloads/downloads.html
