Repeater News

Karl/W4KRL, Dwight/K9ERF, Arthur/KW4AW visited the repeater site on Saturday, 23 November. Karl and Dwight to survey the battery scene and take pictures; Arthur to tweak the repeater audio's. Karl got some good information and data regarding the batteries (which turned out to be in rather poor condition). Dwight got the repeater "warts and hairs" recorded on film. Arthur tweaked. Unfortunately, the tweaks didn't do the job and the 2-meter audio joined the 220 audio in the nasty category.

Karl will have a **short presentation** at the **December meeting** about the repeater **battery back-up system** and a **replacement plan** for the current battery bank.

Butch/W4HJL and **Arthur/KW4AW** paid a visit to the **repeater site** on 04 December. The primary purpose for this visit was to **make sure** that the **repeaters** are **ready** to support **operations for the snow storms** forecasted for 4/5 December **and** for the **Christmas Parade** on 7 December.

We re-installed the 440-repeater power amplifier (which Butch had repaired earlier last month). We made more tweaks on receiver audio for the 2-meter and 220 repeaters. The transmitter deviation and DTMF/CW ID tone levels were also readjusted to provide more comfortable listening. Power level adjustments were made to the 440 power-amplifier to set it at approximately 70 watts output; the 2-meter repeater is also operating at 70 watts output and no power adjustments were required.

Hams Radio Reports Tell of Devastating Guam Typhoon (Dec 10, 2002) -- Reports via Amateur Radio have provided a picture of the devastating aftermath of so-called "Supertyphoon Pongsona," which struck the Pacific Island territory of Guam December 8. A team of Amateur Radio operators affiliated with the US Department of Health and Human Services was set to depart this week for Guam. Pongsona is the third typhoon to hit Guam since June. The storm has essentially cut off communication between the island and the rest of the world.
