Some Possibly Useful or Interesting Information

- 1. Many individuals who obtain a beginner ham license will want to upgrade to a higher licence with more privileges and those who have had a higher privilege license for some time (or many years) may want to check to determine if they still know enough to pass the current exam. The prospective upgraders too want to know if they are ready to take the new exam with a prospect of success. In either case, this is easy to do all of the current VEC FCC examination questions and answers are available for free. Check out http://ncvec.org
- 2. Last month we gave a video link for a local (near Leesburg) drone flyby video of K4VV's HF antenna system. Not to be outdone, Tim / K3LR who maintains a mammoth HF antenna system a multioperator station on the Pennsylvania-Ohio border just south of Interstate 80 in Pennsylvania now has a drone flyby video of his antenna system on YouTube too. To see K3LR's antennas, go to http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OMzdTQzJjSc
- 3. Many young hams get interested in the design of electronic circuitry, whether just out of curiosity, to better understand how their equipment works or to modify or improve their equipment or to create new accessories for it. Some get interested enough to study that and related subjects in school and/or to make a career from it. Manufacturers of components for electronic circuits want to make sales and, therefore, tend to make technical and design information on their products readily available to designers. The component manufacturing firm, Analog Devices, is one of those and has a wide selection of "free" technical data and design publications available on its web site. If you're interested, look at http://www.analog.com/library/analogdialogue There you will find many items, including: specific product literature, application notes for specific products, eBooks (in PDF format) and eNewsletters on a wide variety of related subjects, an EngineerZone (engineering forums), lists of Frequently Asked and Rarely Asked Questions, and much more. Quite a collection of materials, much of which is not particularly specific to Analog Devices' products.
- 4. The Reverse Beacon Network system (http://www.reversebeacon.net/) has been mentioned here a number of times as a real innovation for real time (and near real time) monitoring of worldwide HF propagation conditions on the ham bands. The basic principles of operation are quite simple: a diverse group of hams located all around the globe who participate in the system have broadband HF receivers which listen to the HF CW (Morse Code) ham bands. The output of each receiver is processed locally by a software program known as the CW Skimmer [available at dxatlas.com] which measures the signal strength and frequency of each CW signal received and automatically decodes and processes basic information being sent via Morse Code (specifically the station identification, which is then used to determine the station location) in each signal. This processed information at specific receiving sites is then forwarded via the Internet to central RBN aggregation points which are accessible to public users who log in to obtain access to the aggregated data which becomes available on the RBN servers usually with only a very slight time delay. Not satisfied with the additional delays and effort of having to manually access and interpret the HF propagation data publicly available on the RBN servers, a New Zealand ham, ZL2HAM, has developed a program (ViewProp) which can be custom setup to automatically analyze the real time HF propagation conditions and paths in a given locale to other distant points and display that information in an intuitive and easy to grasp form on a global atlas. This is extremely innovative and powerful; check out http://zl2ham.wikispaces.com for more information and details. ViewProp uses the DX Atlas software product also available at dxatlas.com for its global mapping system. Because the basic RBN system itself functions automatically (with minimal human intervention, except when repairs, fixes and upgrades are needed) and is also quite extensive in its geographical coverage, the ViewProp system reportedly can be used by an operator at a given location to transmit several simple, short HF CW test signals, and then sit back and view the output for his/ her ViewProp display to determine at which distant locations his/her signal is actually being heard at adequate signal strength to allow for real contacts (whether on CW, SSB or digital modes). It is possible to determine very quickly whether a particular HF band currently supports propagation to particular distant locations or is "dead".
- 5. HF propagation mysteries partial explanations. Many factors which affect HF propagation are well known, but how it all really works is still shrouded with a lot of mystery, complex physics and earth and solar science. A presentation at the Huntsville Hamfest earlier this year: http://solarscience.msfc.nasa.gov/presentations/20130817_Hamfest.ppt has helpful explanations. Not too technical and worth looking at if you want to improve or test your understanding.
- 6. Jim Brown / K9YC maintains a web site with a large number of ham radio "how to do it" technical articles which he has authored. Go to http://k9yc.com/publish.htm Very solid stuff, the latest is on short vertical antennas.
