

### VP's Corner

#### Jeff Fuller WB6UIE

This month we'll explore what has become one of amateur radio's hottest high tech topics - Software Defined Radio, or SDR.



SDR works by sampling the radio frequency spectrum and turning those samples into a stream of bits. Sounds simple, but it takes quite a bit of computing horsepower to do so in real time. Seems like just a few years ago in grad school when this was a computer exercise (submitted on punched cards) and actual SDR was just a pipe dream.

Today, with the addition of a digitizer and software, you can have your own SDR running on a PC. Here's a short You Tube video covering SDR basics https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ydoDaeAhsso

You can listen to a variety of SDRs from around the world via http://websdr.org/ Cascade your sound card's output to Fldigi to demodulate digital modes. Or see how your own signal sounds on various bands at some of your favorite DX spots.



Waterfall display from an SDR in the UK http://hackgreensdr.org:8901/



#### REMEMBERING TOM McDONALD / KB1FLK

OVH member, Tom McDonald, KB1FLK, passed away unexpectedly at age 62 on December 21, 2017. In addition to being active in the OVH in the radio world, Tom was active in the Manassas CERT with

his wife, Donna, KB1IKU. He is survived by his wife, three children and three grandchildren.

Tom was always interested in technical matters and was a "get it done" "hands on" type individual. He started his career supporting the US Navy's Fleet Ballistic Missile (FBM) Program in 1979 when he hired into General Electric Ordnance Systems (GEOS) in Pittsfield, MA as a Field Engineer. In Charleston SC in 1984 he was the Test Director on the USS John C. Calhoun SSBN-630. In 1985 he took a promotion as the Squadron Representative in Bangor WA. In the mid 1990s as he led the first technical refresh of the Fire Control System onboard SSBNs. In 1996 he transferred to Systems Engineering were he supervised all of the Fire Control Test berths. He left the FBM Program in 1998 and went to work at the Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI) in Lenox. MA. Tom returned to the FBM Program in 2001 when he was hired by the United States Navy Program Management Office (PMO) Strategic Systems Program's (SSP) in Pittsfield, MA. He transferred to SSP headquarters in the Washington Navy



Yard (WNY) to work for the SSP Fire Control Branch in 2006. He took a promotion to lead one of the Launcher Branches sections in 2012. His technical expertise and work covered hands on installations during new construction as well as technical refreshes of hardware and software. He truly left a positive mark on a program critical to our national defense.

We will all miss him.

#### REMEMBERING MILT WARNOCK / N4SN

Milton Paul Warnock / N4SN, a long time member of the OVH, was born in January 1930 in rural northwest Georgia; he passed away very unexpectedly on December 20, 2017. We know Milt's passing was unexpected because he had just renewed his ham license, N4SN, for ten more years on December 19th according to the FCC's official records. Milt was always interested in radio communications, and was a first class CW (Morse code) operator, his favorite mode for ham radio communications.

In service to our nation (see below) and in his private life, Milt truly connected the world. A licensed amateur radio operator since 1953 (his first callsign was W4DIW), Milt spoke with people around the globe and was an active member of the Ole Virginia Hams Amateur Radio Club for over thirty-five years. Some OVH members and others may actually know him better by his call sign — N4SN — than by his real name. Milt was a regular fixture at OVH Field Day events each June, and he often worked the CW position on the overnight shift, greatly increasing the OVH's Field Day points totals. He was also a private pilot for much of his life and explored the world from the skies of his Foreign Service assignments.

After graduating high school in 1947 Milt joined the Army Air Corps as a communications technician, and served in Ohio, Texas, and the territory of Alaska. He also had the distinction of serving during the transition of the Army Air Corps' into the United States Air Force. On his honorable discharge from the Air Force as a Sergeant in 1950, Milt worked as a Department of the Army civilian in the Pentagon, a radio operator for Eastern Airlines, and a broadcast engineer.

In 1955, at age 25, Milt joined the U.S. Department of State as a communications officer. Some of the old-timers (from the 1970's or earlier) reading this will remember that various US Government agencies

(especially the State Department and the CIA) used to place recruitment advertisements in QST Magazine for overseas positions which required good working skills in CW (Morse Code) communications. Milt had those.

Milt's first overseas posting was the Philippines, and his second was Tunisia, where he met and married his wife Marguerite. Together, Marguerite and Milt were posted in Ceylon -now Sri Lanka, Ethiopia, Brazil, Iran, the Philippines (twice), and Washington, DC. A few of Milt's QSL cards from the various callsigns he held or used are shown above



and to the right. Milt also traveled the world for temporary duty assignments, including to La Paz, Bolivia in support of embassy communications in the western hemisphere during the Cuban Missile Crisis.



After retiring from government service in 1978, Milt worked in the private sector for ten years as a broadcast engineer and a charter employee of C-SPAN before finally fully embracing retirement. Milt is survived by his son, Tom Warnock (now callsign W4DIW) and his wife; his brother Dan and his wife various other relatives.

We will all remember and miss Milt. The picture collage above about Milt was assembled by Theresa / KG4TVM.
