PRESIDENT'S LETTER:


Hello Everyone!

Some Possibly Interesting or Useful Information

- 1. Last month this column was a "special" which focused on lightning, especially those aspects that affect ham radio installations and personal safety. Bad Karma. The weather Gods must not have liked those remarks and sought immediate retribution: since then I have experienced two very close by lightning strikes at my QTH and three electrical power outages triggered by nearby thunderstorms. Normally, we experience only one or two power outages per year, and a very close by lightning strike which causes property damage within the house about once every 10 years. The first very close by lightning strike destroyed our in house DSL modem and the underground telephone line feeding the DSL signal. Voltage or current transients circulated within the wired Ethernet network within the house, taking out two Ethernet switches and one of four VOIP modems, and partially damaging our business PBX system, and several of the telephone extensions from it. After some partial repairs / replacements, the second strike event occurred, causing further transients on the wired Ethernet network and more damage to the PBX system. That system which has worked flawlessly for 10+ years is still not fully repaired and working yet. Fortunately, almost everyone now has pocket cellular telephones so we have been able to can limp along with the main telephone system not working properly. Fortunately there was no damage to ham equipment as none was connected to transmission lines to outdoor antennas.
- 2. Despite the close by lightning events at my QTH since last month, I will further tempt fate by recounting briefly the most spectacular lightning damage event that I witnessed. It occurred at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in March, 1987 during the launch of Atlas-Centaur 67 carrying a Navy FLEETSATCOM satellite payload. AC-67 successfully left the launch pad in stable, controlled flight and entered the overcast above at about 12000 feet AGL; at 14000 feet AGL still in the clouds, a cloud to vehicle lightning strike occurred, which caused a single bit flip in the bit sequence running through the onboard guidance computer; fortuitously, that single bit flip caused the guidance computer almost immediately to command a full yaw deflection of the rocket motor gimbal even though AC-67 was still accelerating at full thrust. Range safety immediately noticed the deviation from the telemetry, but the destruct command it sent was unneeded - AC-67 had already tumbled and was breaking apart into pieces from the acceleration forces. I was in the launch command center when this happened and saw the numerous displays there suddenly flat-line or go blank; the mood of everyone there changed from jubilant to very somber in an instant. There was no explosion, and AC-67's pieces fell into the sea not far offshore. The vehicle guidance computer itself, a 1960 design with 1960's hardware, was recovered intact. I had an opportunity to inspect it a few months later at the contractor's facility near Los Angeles where it was being analyzed; the physical and electrical damage was minimal. Exactly how that particular fortuitous bit flip occurred was never determined, but there was no doubt that it was caused the lightning strike in the clouds. As a result of that failure, the cloud and weather launch criteria were significantly changed and new launch pad structures were built to bleed off electrostatic build up. Experts theorized that the high temperature and violent rocket exhaust during assent created an ionization trail to the ground, increasing the potential difference between the vehicle and the surrounding environment during assent, facilitating lightning discharge. That single lightning strike caused a loss of more than \$400,000,000 in an brief instant. Google: Atlas-Centaur 67 to find out more about that.
