
Well done to Byron, AK4XR, and his team for a very successful Field Day. We had a good turnout, the weather was nice, and the food superb.



Some Possibly Interesting or Useful Information

- 1. Ken / KE2N gave an excellent tutorial about coaxial cable, matching networks and SWR adjustment during the OVH Field Day event. In case you missed it, Ken's handout in PDF format is now posted online at: http://w4ovh.net/SpecEvnts/FieldDay/2017/2017_W4OVH_FieldDayTrainingActivity_KE2N.pdf
- 2. One of the excellent resources mentioned in Ken / KE2N's handout is the graphically based SWR calculation application for Windows computers by AE6TY, a professional quality application. You can find it and download it at http://www.ae6ty.com/Smith_Charts.html Your editor attended a live forum session by AE6TY about his SWR application at the Dayton Hamvention several years ago and wrote about it in this Newsletter. AE6TY has continued to enhance and improve his application.
- 3. A new (non-technical) book is coming out this summer about Claude Shannon who is sometimes referred to as the inventor of the (digital) information age. Certainly, anyone who has studied communications and information theory at the technical level knows of his great contributions to source and channel encoding theory and practice, critical elements (now taken for granted) of all modern communications systems. Shannon's seminal 1948 paper: http://math.harvard.edu/~ctm/home/text/others/shannon/entropy/entropy.pdf is still worth reading. The unified (and simplified) ideas presented in that paper led to rapid and massive advances. See also,

an earlier discussion about Claude Shannon ten years ago in the May 2007 OVH Newsletter.


