Progress at Mt. Pone

Good news. The new shed which is needed as a dedicated housing for the OVH's D-Star Repeaters and other equipment was delivered to the Mt. Pone site earlier this month. See image to the right which shows Butch / W4HJL and Bob / K4HJL posing in front of the new shed which is in front of the newly painted "Robin's Egg Blue" water tower. Next steps will be to insulate the shed, get HVAC installed in it, and get a hook up to the nearby electrical power source. After that, running transmission lines, installing antennas, and reinstalling the 2m and 70cm D-Star repeaters. Have patience! It will probably be a few more months until this is all completed.



Using the OVH's Closed E-Mail Reflector System

The OVH closed email reflector (w4ovh@googlegroups.com) is a benefit of OVH membership and is available to all members in good standing. The email reflector automatically forwards incoming messages from registered OVH users to all OVH members who have email address(es) registered with the OVH's E-Mail Reflector Administrator, David Lane / KG4GIY. Incoming emails from email addresses which are not registered to OVH members are not forwarded. This system allow rapid dissemination of messages to the OVH membership, most of whom are registered users. Further information about how to use the e-mail reflector is on the club web site at <http://w4ovh.net>.

Questions come up from new OVH members from time to time about how to get registered: to get registered, someone (usually the Secretary or Membership chair) has to notify David / KG4GIY to confirm that you are now an OVH member so your email address can be added to the master list of authorized email addresses for the system. Occasionally, this breaks down. If you have never sent a message to David / KG4GIY to get registered, please contact the Membership chairman and have him send David a note so you can be registered. This solves two problems - first, that will ensure that you are a member in good standing and second, that will provide the email address to be added to the authorized user list for you to use. That will saves a number of back and forth emails to get you set up. .

Occasionally, incoming message to the reflector are automatically flagged by the system as spam. What can you do? If you have always been able to send to the reflector and a message you sent doesn't show up, drop David / KG4GIY a note. Odds are it got caught in the spam detector. Depending on a number of variables, it could be days before Google tells David that it is hung up. If you inform David directly, he can go in and release the message - as soon as he is near a PC that is.

Of course, if your machine or email account is compromised and you start spamming the list or a topic gets beyond the focus of Amateur Radio or degrades into unwelcome territory, the Administrator has the latitude to suspend, moderate, or terminate your immediate access. Such problem situations are very rare.

“National Parks On The Air” Activation by David / KK4ZUU on January 1, 2016

The ARRL is sponsoring a “National Parks On The Air” activity throughout 2016 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the U.S. National Park system. See, <http://www.arrl.org/NPOTA> Not to be left behind at all, OVH member David / KK4ZUU decided to activate the Manassas National Battlefield Park on January 1, 2016.

Following is David’s account, which some pictures taken by Theresa / KG4TVM:

“This morning I was surprised by John and Theresa Heartney who showed up as a surprise to see if I needed help setting up my NPOTA activation. We tried to setup a concept 1” PVC antenna support 20 feet tall, it flexed itself to the ground and I decided to rig my trusty dipole instead. John and Theresa were QSO #1 and #2 to start me off on 2m.

“I ended up operating the way I do at home, I used my fishing pole and a weight to hang the far end of my Chameleon EMCOMM II antenna about 25 feet up a tree and I suspended the balun end 10 feet off the ground on my (shortened) PVC stand about 20 feet from my vehicle. I have hung this antenna at home using just about the same equipment about 5 times in a year, the cold just made it take a bit longer.

“I spoke to another ham that stopped by for a while, I showed him that I could blanket the East Coast using 40m and JT65 on my ‘L’ power setting on my IC-7200 (250 milliwatts). I showed him the pskreporter website, he was surprised how far a digital signal would go. I put the plans to operate digital away, I decided to operate SSB ‘today’.

“I spotted myself via dxsummit on 6m [50.128, 1744 hrs GMT], after 30 minutes of silence and no takers (propagation) I moved/spotted myself on 10m (28.406, 1813 hrs GMT) and had an immediate QSO...then silence for the next 30+ minutes of calling CQ.

“I really did not get my operations ‘going’ until I spotted myself on 20m (14.285 mhz) at 1900 hrs GMT [2 pm EST] on dxsummit.fi. Within 2 minutes I was being called by 10+ stations at a time for about 30 minutes until another person decided they wanted the frequency and took it over. That was fun while it lasted, being chased vs chasing. QSY.

“I moved to (20m) 14.265 mhz [1933 hrs GMT], spotted myself again and

called CQ. I picked up 14 contacts in about 30 minutes. This time a net started up, no one checked for the frequency to see if it was in-use. QSY again, they were trying to pass traffic so I moved again...

“By this time it was 3:15pm EST. The park closes at dark so I moved to 40m (7.233 mhz). I worked about 17 people in 30 minutes, again it was an initial rush of ten people and then seven stragglers. Then...wait for it....another operator in the NPOTA event out west took over my frequency (this is why I prefer to run digital modes 90% of the time!).

“I noticed the winter sun was less than 15 degrees off the horizon so I went QRT at 3:45 pm EST and packed up my operation to head home.

“In summary, I worked 3@2m FM, SSB: 1@10m, 36@20m, and 17@40m. I learned a lot, and I know some things to change the next time.

“I will activate another park, when it’s warmer and I can sit outside of my vehicle.”

A few editorial observations about this: David’s description makes this all sound quite easy - which it probably was for someone as well organized and knowledgeable as David, particularly with a few very knowledgeable, unexpected helpers too! The trick to successful and “easy” portable operating is always careful planning ahead so that you will have everything you need with you in the field. David’s use of Internet based spotting networks (originally known as DX cluster servers on 2m packet) was also a great idea in this situation; a large number of operators worldwide are always watching those, particularly operators looking for DX or unusual contacts, and it is a good way to attract an incoming “pile-up” for this type of operation. Use of the psk reporter web site to check propagation conditions with JT65 is also a great idea as it gives one certainty that the band(s) are really open even though relatively few signals are actually being heard! Some other OVHers should try this!



More Notes about Learning Morse Code and Increasing CW Code Copy Speed

The ARRL still provides excellent Morse Code practice transmissions on the HF bands. The text for these transmissions are from recent issues of QST magazine. <http://www.arrl.org/w1aw-operating-schedule> lists the schedules for these on the air transmissions. The best frequencies in this area in the evenings recently for these transmissions from W1AW are 1.8025 MHz on the 160 m band and 3.5815 MHz on the 80 m band. In addition to these over the air code practice transmissions, ARRL also offers freely downloadable code practice audio in MP3 files with different CW code speeds and text files with the letters, words, numbers, symbols and text for each MP3 file. This allows one, with a little effort, to set up a very useful system to increase one’s CW copy speed. Download and print some text files corresponding to particular MP3 files. Then play an MP3 audio file while watching (i.e., following along) with the corresponding printed text. After a while doing this at initially a higher CW speed than you can comfortably copy, you will find that your CW copy speed will increase! Why: by following the MP3 CW sounds with the associated printed text before you, you will find that your ability to decode or recognize CW sounds and associate those sound with the letters will increase. Eventually, your CW copy speed will notch up. At that point, you can begin practicing again at a higher CW speed. MP3 files with speeds from 5 wpm up to more than 35 wpm are available!
