Sandy / KM4JUS gave the scholarship report. Sandy presented one Steve Frick scholarship to Deyan Saleem who will major in BioMedical engineering. Sandy, Jay / NQ4T and Jan / KE4TMW had previously presented the other scholarship to Hannah Palmer who will major in Chemical Engineering.

The minutes of the May 2021 meeting were amended to have KO4MBN's name changed from Mike to Mark. The minutes were approved as so amended.

Treasurer's report – no report.

ARES report - no report.

Ken / KE2N gave the repeater report. All repeaters are working. Ken reported that he had found six computers connected via VNC to the new wires-x machine. OVH Tailgate Event - Preparation and Wrap-Up from Ken / KN4DD

After months of planning, three planning meetings (one virtual and two in person) the Ole Virginia Hams finally held its first Tailgate Party on Saturday, June 12, 2021.

I wanted to share with you the amount of work that went into this event and to acknowledge the incredible amount of effort of the planning and implementation crews. From the Tailgate event planning committee, we would like to recognize the following individuals: John / KG4NXT, Theresa / KG4TVM, Sandy / KM4JUS, Ray / KM4EKR, Don / WA2SWX, Ken / KN4DD, Ron / K3FR, Tony / KM4KLB and Gil / KM4OZH. We would especially like to recognize Tony / KM4KLB for the amount of effort he put into planning the layout of our Tailgate Party. It is a truism that no plan ever withstands first contact with the enemy. In this case, the enemy was the weather. Our scheduled day for set up was Friday, June 11 and we received about 2 inches of rain between Thursday morning and Friday night. So things were looking very soggy and not so good on Friday going into Saturday. We would like to recognize our implementation team: John / KG4NXT, Al / KB4BHB, Tony / KM4KLB and Jim / KM4SXM for their work on Friday and early on Saturday morning to prepare the site for the Tailgate Event. .

Just a few of the pictures (below) which appear to present a light fog condition. But it wasn't fog, it was a light steady rain which was only happening at the time of these photographs in the afternoon. The actual installation took place around 10 AM on Friday where it looked like the sky had just opened up and poured water on everybody.



Definitely looking a bit grim on Friday. But Semper Gumby - Always Flexible. Our team could have been Marines as they adapted and overcame, working out a way to delineate parking spaces despite the rain on Friday.

The planning committee had already had to work around the corona virus restrictions for places to have our event and to even have in person meetings. But we powered through. As already noted, the week of the event was an eventful one weather wise. The days immediately before the event were rain soaked. But we adapted.

There was a great deal of planning by many individuals before the event and as you would expect, on the day of the event, real life event happened. We thought we were onto something with our event, because of the level of interest we generated before the event: web page

comments, emails and even phone calls. Our flyer said we would run from 8 AM till 2 PM.

Almost immediately vendors and potential vendors started contacting us asking if they could set up earlier. Many indicated it would take at least an hour for them to set up.

Semper Gumby. So, we changed our rules and said to the vendors you can come at 7 AM.

On the day of the event both vendors and spenders began arriving at 6 AM and wanted in - just like at a Manassas Hamfest. Semper Gumby - again!

We had plenty of volunteers for traffic control, but because of the early hour, they were still a bit sleepy. It was a bit of a crisis too because the coffee machine broke down.

Again, we adapted. Gil, KM4OZH was able to fix the coffee machine, which in turn fixed the volunteers. We directed incoming traffic to the proper helpers who directed to the parking locations. It now worked like a well oiled machine.

After around 2 inches of rain in the previous 48 hours we caught a break weather wise. The drainage of our field was first rate. We didn't develop mud and no person or vehicle got stuck.

While it remained overcast for our entire of vent, it was cool, around 75°. Additionally, there was no humidity. This ensured that most of our patrons were comfortable temperature wise, although a good number of sweaters and sweatshirts were observed.

OVH Supports the first post-pandemic Manassas Mini Tri - Sunday June 27, 2021

Sunday, June 27th, 2021 marked the return of the Manassas Mini Tri, and once again the Ole Virginia Hams provided communications support and acted as spotters.

Andy / KJ4MTP was our coordinator at the event, which was held once again at The Freedom Aquatic & Fitness Center, Manassas, Virginia.

Scheduled to start at 8:15 AM, Andy wanted us there no later than 7:30 AM for our assignments and actual positioning. To get us there on time, Andy bribed us with donuts, but to be fair, he made us bring our own coffee. Oh well.

We did not have enough OVHers, however, so several Check Points went unmanned. Be that as it may, the Prince William County Police provided a very robust presence. There were five patrol cars each with officers where I was stationed, on Freedom Center Boulevard alone.

We would like to recognize the following hams who participated: Andy / KJ4MTP – Code Name "Shadow" – as our coordinator; Chris / KO4OZI – at Check Point 1; Ken / KN4DD – at Check Point 2; Dick / KM4UXE – at Check Point 4; Jerry / KN4DWT – at Check Point 5; Al / KB4BHB – at Check Point 6; Oscar / KN4DWW – Check Point 7; Wayne / N7QLK – at Check Point 8; and Eric / KJ4MSW – at Check Point 9.

The sequence of the events was as follows:

MANASSAS-MINI-TRI at approximately 0815:

- Triathlon: Swim 250 yards – Bike 4 miles – Run 1.5 miles
- Duathlon: Run 1.5 miles – Bike 4 miles – Run 1.5 miles
- Aquabike: Swim 250 yards – Bike 4 miles
- Tri Relay: 2 or 3 person teams with each person completing 1 or 2 legs of the triathlon

While we were there to render assistance if and when needed, I am happy to report none was needed. Within this context, an uneventful race is a good race. While a tad overcast and a bit humid, the weather for the most part, cooperated with us. The day certainly got hotter and far more humid, but the races were over by then.

The last of the races was over by around 11:30 AM. Plenty of time left for everyone to get back into their Sunday. These were good races.

THE SETUP

June 25, 2021 was the day before the first day of Field Day. It was also “Setup Day”.

As in some past years, we had a team out to shoot pull line in the trees which become support for field day antennas. Most years we do this with easy-ups and home made easy-up consisting of a sling shot and a fishing reel & weight. This year, we also had a drone dropping lines (George / K4GVT) and a very effective pneumatic launcher made by Jeff / K9VEG.

There was no rain and the lines went up. Our infrastructure erectors included Byron / AK4XR; Jeff / WB4TT; Gil / KM4OZH; Al / KB4BHB; Gene / N4HFW; John / KG4NXT; Harry / KN4IJY; Jay / NQ4T and Ron / K3FR.

Early Saturday morning we gathered to finish setup before field day started at 2 PM. We put up an 80 meter Windom, a 40 meter wire beam and the 160 meter horizontal loop. Gil loaned Ron his portable tower and Ron assembled it and put on several VHF/UHF beams. We also assembled the local area network for logging and two networks of electrical extension cord – one for generator power and one for laptops and lights from the mains. The rigs included John’s IC-7610, Jay’s 7100, Wayne, AG4ZZ’s QRP solar powered CW rig and Jeff, K9VEG’s CW rig.
