Visiting guest, John / KX4O from the Sterling ARC, gave a presentation on the upcoming Virginia QSO party. The FT8 mode will be allowed this year but it is not yet clear how the QSO party exchange will need to be modified for the FT8 mode.

The minutes of the previous OVH meeting were approved.

Don / WA2SWX gave the Treasurer's report which was duly approved.

Luther / WA3FMO gave the Membership report. There was one new read-in this month, to be voted upon at the February meeting: Johnny Keaton / KJ7DAK

ARES report. No report.

Ken / KE2N gave a written Repeater Report. All the repeaters are working but the 5 GHz link between NOVEC and Mount Pone is down.

Mark / WA4KFZ gave the training report. Mark is working on slides and a presentation for the new FCC maximum permissible RF exposure limits.

Don / WA2SWX gave the Committee report for the Manassas Hamfest to be held on June 4, 2022. The next Hamfest Committee meeting will be on January 25th, watch email on the closed OVH email reflector for details. The Shenandoah Valley ARC appears ready to do the VE testing at the Manassas Hamfest, but that is still to be confirmed. Don reported that the OVH has been given a table and two free tickets to Vienna Wireless' upcoming March 27th Winterfest which will include the ARRL's Virginia Section meeting.

Theresa / KG4TVM gave a report on plans for the upcoming Winter Field Day. We will be operating out of a cabin in Shenandoah River State Park starting January 29th at 2:00 pm; OVH club members are invited and welcome to visit.

Theresa also gave the Sunshine Report. Ken / KN4DD had his birthday; Art / W1CRO has COVID.

Ken / KN4DD gave the Web Committee report. Another concentrated SQL injection attack occurred, this time originating in Germany. The software handled the attack well. Kevin / KX4KU is working on a test environment for the OVH web.

The 50/50 raffle has a gross of \$148. Andy won.

New Business: Andy / KJ4MTP raised three items:

HAMFEST AND VE SESSION TYPE EVENTS:

The COVID pandemic, although now winding down or ending, depending upon who you believe, regrettably, has STILL killed off many of the live Hamfest type events. No live full feature Hamfests are currently scheduled nearby until the end of March.

March 27, 2022, the Vienna Wireless Hamfest, better known as Winterfest at the Northern Virginia Community College, Annandale Campus. See, the Flyer later in this Newsletter for full details, including times. Tickets can be ordered on line in advance (\$10+) or purchased at the door (\$15). This close by hamfest is a favorite for many OVH members and OVH usually is an exhibitor at this Hamfest.

May 19 (Thursday), 2022, 7:00am to 5:00pm. The Contest University live training session about ham radio contesting and station and antenna system improvements and optimization will take place at the Hope Hotel in Dayton, Ohio. Go to contestuniversity.com for details. This is a highly recommended full day program presented by highly qualified and well known instructors; takes place one day before the first day of the nearby Dayton Hamvention. An excellent way to improve your knowledge and skills. Advance registration is required.

May 20 (Friday) - May 22 (Sunday), 2022. Dayton Hamvention at the Greene County Fairgrounds, near Dayton, Ohio. After uncertainties again due to COVID, this Hamfest, the largest in the Western Hemisphere, is now set to take place again. If you decide to make the trek, consider attending the Contest University training session on May 19th (see above).

June 4, 2022, Saturday, 6:30 am to 12:30 pm, Manassas Hamfest at the Manassas Park Community Center! Report on Winter Field Day Ops - John / KG4NXT

On January 29th and 30th, OVH operated Winter Field Day from a cabin at the Shenandoah River State Park near Front Royal, Virginia. The operators at the cabin for this event were Don / WA2SWX, Ron / K3FR; Gil / KM4OZH and John / KG4NXT.

Several OVH members were on the air to work us as the contest started. The cabin crew worked George / K4GVT and Al / KB4BHB. Butch / W4HJL and Wayne / N7QLK reported they gave us calls but the cabin crew was unable to hear them. We made phone, CW and digital contacts; because the Winter Field Day rules prohibited use of the FT8 digital mode, we used PSK31 to make more than 40 digital, keyboard / screen to keyboard / screen contacts.

OVH member Elizabeth / KG4NXV and her family flew in from Washington state. Baby Ben was a big hit with everyone.

The Washington area, including Front Royal, had a snow event during the weekend, but the roads remained passable. Don and John put up a 134 foot end fed wire antenna while the snow was falling. The initial fish line was a bit short which caused Don to tie the pull line to the fish line on his tippy-toes while snow was falling. It turned out to be tunable from 160m to 15m. Don made his very first 160m contact using that antenna.



It was a social occasion as well as a contest occasion. Theresa / KG4TVM cooked an excellent rib and corn bread dinner and John made waffles for breakfast.

Some Possibly Useful or Interesting Information.

1. The author of the EZNEC antenna design software, Roy Lewellen, W7EL, has retired; many of his Antenna Modeling software products are now available “free” but with no maintenance or technical support. Go to EZNEC.com for more info. W7EL’s software has been around since the early 1990’s with a long history of adding new features and improvements. Limited versions have been distributed with the ARRL Antenna Handbooks for use to create radiation and gain diagrams for many ham and other antenna. The ARRL has an “Antenna Modeling for Beginners” page on its web site with many resources at <http://arrl.org/antenna-modeling-for-beginners> and the ARRL’s bookstore carries at least one book specifically about Antenna Modeling.

2. The Peekskill / Cortlandt (NY) Amateur Radio Association has regularly published the PCARA Newsletter; for quite a few years now, that PCARA Newsletter has been distributed to OVH members via the OVH’s closed email reflector, thanks to OVH member, George / K4GVT, who was an active PCARA member before he relocated to Virginia, and several PCARA members. Malcom / NM9J of PCARA and others have written many detailed technical articles about radio, ham radio, software and electronics. An archive of the PCARA Newsletters in PDF format is available at <http://nm9j.com/pcara/newslett.htm>, a relatively obscure Internet URL. To search that trove of technical articles through your web browser for a particular “technical topic”, use the following search terms `site:NM9J.com “technical topic”`. Good luck - you’ll probably be quite pleased with what you find there!

3. The Virginia QSO Party - upcoming on March 19 and 20th. Check out the rules at https://www.qsl.net/sterling/VA_QSO_Party/2022_VQP/2022_VQP_Main.html. Save those dates and plan to participate even if just for a half hour or so - but beware, the event can be addictive once you begin to make contacts. The quickest and easiest way is to get in on the fun is on VHF / UHF FM, tune around or call on the suggested calling frequencies. Keep at least a paper log and plan to mail it in; mention that you are affiliated with the OVH club!
