HAM RADIO OPERATING / CONTEST EVENTS:



ARRL / OVH FIELD DAY (June 25 / 26, 2022) Round Up Notes and Pictures

These comments below are thanks to John / KG4NXT; John's full article is on the Club's W4OVH web site at https://w4ovh.net/ovh-field-day-best-in-20-years

For our 2022 Field Day, we claimed 5,266 points. As a reference, we claimed 2,648 in 2012 and 2,526 in 2021. We had terrific operators including Bill / AF4LL; Wayne / AG4ZZ; Ron / K3FR; Byron / AK4XR; Don / WA2SWX; Jim / KM4SXM; Mark / WA4KFZ and John / KG4NXT.

We also had a super under 18 YL operator – Sarah Peart – who made 19 FT8 contacts.

We had a very unusual antenna mount. Byron / AK4XR who brought his cherry picker and Gil / KM4OZH made an antenna rotator for it. This was used for the VHF station.

Some years, we have not been able to get an elected official for the bonus points. This year we got two: 1) Prince William Supervisor Victor S. Angry invited by Theresa / KG4TVM and Lynn F. Greene, member Manassas City Council invited by David / KQ4BDS. We also had an ARRL assistant section manager from Utah – Jerri / WJ3RI. Finally, we had Tobin, whose unit was operating as K4VDF for Field Day, invited by daughter Cat / KM4PBD, as a member of a served agency.

Our (old) chef Phil / AC4PL was not able to help out due to illness this year. Theresa did

the food planning and bought the food. Byron and Cat cooked dinner. Bill, AF4LL paid for the food we purchased. We also had lots of potluck food. Thanks to all who brought food for the potluck dinner.

We had lots of bonus points. Here is a list of the bonus points not already mentioned: Tony / KM4KLB for section manager and 10 formal messages; Ron / K3FR for copying the ARRL bulletin message; Wayne / AG4ZZ for natural power QSOs with power provided by solar panels; Theresa / KG4TVM for the information table, social media, and media publicity; Wayne / N7QLK got our safety officer points; Byron / AK4XR and Cat / KM4PBD did the educational activity with a Fox Hunt; and Byron also got a youth participant for bonus points.

The preferred digital mode for future Field Day operations: FT4 or FT8? Some post-Field Day 2022 comments by two OVH experts:

Mark / WA4KFZ on the closed OVH email reflector:

One suggestion for next year: I ran 80m FT8 during the night shift (10PM-5AM). This was my first time running the Field Day configuration of the WSJT-X software. While the program works well with the N3FJP logging software, the mode itself is not optimal for working a lot of stations in a Field Day setting. I ran into multiple instances where other stations didn't complete the full exchange, causing the logging software to not register a "completed" QSO. Sometimes I was waiting several minutes for a station to reply because they were running down the list of other contacts they needed to acknowledge (a bit like the fox and hound mode of operation used by DXpedition groups). If we run the same station next year, I would recommend using FT4/FT8 and operating on 20m the entire time. This would leave 80m and 40m "interference free" from the digital modes and allow SSB/CW contacts to rack up more points in the same period of time. One advantage of FT4/FT8 is that it's a weak signal mode. The processing capability of the digital mode should help overcome the reductions in signal strength due to 20m propagation at night.

Responding remarks by Ron / K3FR:

If you were running WSJT-X in the FD mode (either FT4 or FT8) then, if you called the station, you were sending your outbound data i.e. K3FR W4OVH 3A VA to call him. Then, all the other station needs to send is W4OVH K3FR R 1D VA and you need to respond K3FR W4OVH RR73 or W4OVH K3FR RRR. Nothing more is required though some ops do send a 73. I will agree that if the other station received multiple responses to his last CQ or QRZ then, yes, it is painful waiting for him to go down his list. This is where FT4 is more merciful but that is a choice you can make. Nothing is different to the QSO script as far as WSJT-X is concerned.

If you are confident enough, you can call another station and get into the battle from the other end of the cannon. That way, you could be working two or three stations "at the same time" just like the phone and CW guys do while waiting for the other station to send his message to you. A good operator on the other end will just keep to his list and expect your response at the appropriate time. Remember that you are seeing all the signals and decodes in the passband of your receiver at the same time. Note, you cannot have FD and Fox/Hound active at the same time.

The new Digi contest was a good warmup for FD, coming three weeks prior. It allowed me to develop the rhythm for FD. This digital contesting is still quite new and we are ever learning what can and cannot be done to complete a valid contact in minimum time.

My hope for next year is to have the Icom 9700 running with the Icom 7100 in a Single Operator 2 Radio (SO2R) configuration so that I can concentrate on 6 meters and keep an active monitor on 2 meters at the same time. That way, I should not miss any enhanced or active periods on either band. It is possible to do the same for the low bands and get into a Zen state where you re participating two simultaneous contacts for extended periods of time, doubling your actual rate. There is a lot of automation and support for that built into N1MM+ where it is actually orchestrating two instances of WSJT-X at the same time and controlling the interleaving to only use one transmitter at a time. I don't expect to get there in this lifetime.

Editor's note: worth keeping this discussion of points by these OVH eperts in mind for the future!


