PRESIDENT'S LETTER:

Greetings to all.

Some of you probably know that April 3rd, 2023 was the 50th Anniversary of the Cellular Telephone. Inventor Martin Cooper of Motorola used the first portable handset to make the first cell phone call to his rival at Bell Labs. Way to rub it in, Marty.

From 1973 to now, there has been an incredible proliferation of cellphone devices. It seems like everyone has one and many have more than one. Yet, when I ask my



students, mostly middle aged, "How many radio circuits are in an average smartphone?", I usually receive responses (guesses) all over the map. To be fair, some of the dispersion in the typical answers I receive depends upon what different responders think I mean by "radio circuits," but I have determined that many of the responders simply have no idea or clue. Regardless, according to my "reliable sources", there are typically five "radio circuits.": The phone itself is the first one; then wi-fi; Bluetooth; GPS and Near-Field Communication ("NFC") which you may know as "Google Pay" or "Samsung Pay".

This is another reason why our VE Sessions are so important. Far from being "an old man's hobby", Amateur Radio inherently involves old as well as current radio technologies which are modern, rapidly evolving technically. Those who understand modern radio technologies well are very much in demand.

Cellphones, RFID, tablets, phablets, mobile devices of all kinds - we live in a time when radio and the need for radio has never been greater. The paradox to me then is that while so many people, especially the young, know of these devices, they don't

Some Possibly Useful or Interesting Information

I am going to briefly discuss, without delving directly into the mathematics behind it, a very fundamental concept (theorem) relating to signal processing: sampling of a bandlimited, continuous analog signal. In the early 1960s when I first learned about this topic, it was referred to as the Nyquist sampling theorem for sampling an analog signal at the Nyquist rate; The Nyquist sampling rate was a rate equivalent to twice the limited bandwidth of the continuous analog signal. This idea provides a fundamental basis for many (but not all) types of Analog-to-Digital and Digital-to-Analog converters and conversion techniques which are now very common in many types of electronic systems, including radios of all types.

Use of mathematical procedures known as Fourier transforms are needed to shift back and forth between the time and frequency domains to demonstrate this theorem which is now most commonly referred to as the Nyquist-Shannon Sampling theorem. See, the (English) Wikipedia under that topic for more details. It turns out, that Harry Nyquist, at Bell Labs, was originally credited for this in the West, later credit was also given to Claude Shannon also at Bell Labs (and later at MIT). Both Nyquist and Shannon are very well known for many other aspects of their respective work. Shannon, for example, is universally credited and recognized as the originator of Information Theory. It turns out that Vladimir Koltelnikov, a Russian electrical engineer, in the early 1920, was actually the first to publish about this subject (in Russian only); Nyquist's and Shannon's later work was done independently as neither was aware of the publications in Russian. See, German and Russian Wikipedia versions for more details. Koltelnikov's original paper is now available in English translation.

Regardless who is credited, this theorem has very broad implications to modern electronic systems of all types: it holds that sampling of a bandlimited analog signal at a rate equivalent to just twice of the analog bandwidth, and preserving just those sample values (at arbitrary precision) and then processing them, allows one to reconstruct the original, continuous analog signal to arbitrary fidelity. This is truly an astonishing result: it means a sequence of discrete values can be used to reconstruct a bandwidth limited, continuous analog to arbitrary fidelity!
