Slide Presentation about CWops and CW ACADEMY at the January 2024 OVH Meeting A few of Jeff / K9VEG's slides and then some more comments about CW (Morse Code):

CWops is a CW club. Founded in 2010, our goal is to bring together Amateur Radio operators who enjoy communicating by Morse Code (CW). CWops encourages the use of CW in Amateur communications, and it supports CW activity through planned events.

CWops is international in scope, membership and management. Its focus is the use of CW, whether for contesting, DXing, or rag chewing.


CWops offers classes for new operators through its CW Academy.

CWOps holds a High Speed CWT contest every Wednesday at 1300 - 1400z and 1900 - 2000z, and every Thursday at 0300 - 0400z and 0700 - 0800z.

We also have a "giving back" program, where CWops members volunteer to get on the air and look for opportunities to QSO at a moderate speed (15-20 wpm). This is open to everyone.

How can I learn CW through the CW academy?

- You don't have to be an Einstein to learn CW.
- You only need a few tools and the will to learn.
- Learning CW can be done at any age.
- Class sizes are fairly small, 3-6 students usually.
- Classes are FREE!

Not long before that I had learned to touch type on a typewriter in junior high school; once getting over the initial steep learning curve for copying Morse code (just like initially learning to touch type), I recognized that touch typing and copying Morse code were quite similar and neither required any "special talents or skills" to learn: speed and proficiency could and would increase rapidly simply with practice and actual use. NO SPECIAL SKILLS REQUIRED!

Because CW code tests for all ham radio licenses were eliminated in the 1990's, most new ham radio operators now come into ham radio hobby without having learned any Morse code. Many new hams express a desire to learn CW after observing the efficiency of CW operations during a club Field Day event, for example, but are nevertheless deterred by mistaken beliefs that special skills and/or massive amounts to time are required to learn CW to a level of practical proficiency. Jeff / K9VEG's presentation shows that a simple, structured way now exists to learn CW with help from others who are willing to devote time to teach how to learn it. I would encourage everyone to study Jeff's slides on the Member-Only web page at W4OVH.NET and take advantage of the approaches to learning that Jeff suggests.
