--- NEXT MEETING ---

The next meeting of the OVH will take place on the 16th of January. The meeting will begin at 2000 local time at the Northern Virginia Electric Co-Op building on Lomond Dr.

--- LAST MEETING ---

At the last meeting the OVH members voted to approve the inputs of the scholarship committee which consisted of Al Picard (K4IQH), Herb Plummer (W4PJP), Jules Deschenes (WA4ERT) and myself. The agreement was that the OVH would provide one \$500 scholarship to a graduating senior chosen from one of the five local high schools. The schools would select the candidates themselves and then basically we would randomly select one of the five. It has been suggested that we randomly select at a meeting one of the five high schools ahead of time and then inform the school. This is probably the best way to do it as this way we cannot be blamed for possibly being partial, also it prevents the other four schools from doing the work of selecting a candidate only to be refused. At the meeting it was also recommended that the scholarship be given in the name of Victor Clark, exact name to be decided upon at the January meeting. Victor Clark (W4KFC) passed away from a massive heart attack at the Commonwealth Doctors Hospital on the eve of November 25. Vic was the ARRL president and an honorary member of the OUVH. The January 1984 copy of QST described the man that we all loved and adored, for Vic was really the ideal ham that we should all try to be. Aside from being an ideal ham Vic was also a very warm and generous person. The entire radio fraternity feels this great loss.

REPEATER NOTES:

During the past OVH meeting some features and the codes to activate these features were discussed. As stated before, the new controller on our repeater is capable of numerous dazzling things, these features will be incorporated as the membership becomes more familiar with the operation of the newfangled gadgets. For a start, the following features have been enabled and can be used presently:

1. AUTOPATCH (Access = On membership card)
Operation has been set up to be just like the old system (i.e. Enter access code + number in one continuous transmission). The notable difference is that the repeater will read the number back in voice and then dials it.
NOTE: Use "#" button to hang up (Terminate).
2. EMERGENCY AUTODIAL (Access = *)
Presently only "911" is active (i.e. dial *911). BE CERTAIN THAT IT REALLY IS AN EMERGENCY!
3. TIME OF DAY (Access = Not Required)
Dial 80, and the sexy lady will do the rest.
4. PAD TEST (Access = 5)
You can check your touch tone pad buttons by dialing the number 5 and continue with up to 32 consecutive entries. The repeater will read back, in voice, all successful entries and in the order of entry.
5. PAGING (Access = 6)
Two tone paging, or group call paging is done by dialing the number 6 and followed by the first tone group no.+ tone no.;+ second group no.+ tone no. For "GROUP CALL" only that group no.+ tone no. need be entered (preceded of course by the access).
NOTE: Refer to attached chart for assignments of group numbers and tone numbers.

GENERAL INFO: Other features will be enabled in the future and additional information will be published at that time. Please remember that you are required to ID when you access the repeater for whatever reason. If this is not done and abuse is evident, Art W1CRO, our repeater trustee, or any control operator for that matter, will be forced to disable some of these features. The AUTOPATCH will normally be enabled during control operator monitoring (usually from 6AM to 11:30PM weekdays and extended to later on fridays and Saturdays).

As soon as the weather and time permits, some fine tuning of the audio levels and much needed antenna work will be attempted at the repeater site.

When I expounded the virtues of a commercial GE repeater that was well documented, and the ease of maintenance, the ready availability of parts and modules, I did not think it would be so soon that my very words would be so sorely tested. But it happened! As many of you know, our brand new repeater had a defective hybrid IC that caused the PA to become intermittent during cold weather. The club is presently using a loaner (PA) and the original one is going back to the factory for a replacement. It is a darn shame that it happened; however, at least we are not off the air!

The following chart can be used to determine what the group and tone numbers are for the various tone frequencies. All tone frequencies are listed in Hertz and are standard "reed" frequencies supported and used in two-tone sequential paging.

For example: You want to page someone who has a first tone of 707.3 Hz and a second tone of 321.7 Hz. (A and B respectively) You would dial 62440 (Access no.+ first group no.+ tone no.,+ second group no.+ tone no.)

Our new repeater has a PL (Subaudible tone) access mode capability. In the future we may need to activate this mode for various reasons. Therefore, if you wish to equip your rig with an encoder for that purpose, the PL frequency has been set to 146.2Hz.
