



ect: NEW FCC UPDATE PART 97. etin ID: W5YI.APR YED VIA PACKET FROM AMATEUR WORLD LAN/LINE BBS FCC Part 97 rule changes regarding emission designators : Paul Carreiro [N6HCS] : Tue Apr 05 21:32:49 1988 ddition to the changes listed in the previous bbs post, the FCC oses to change the emission designators currently in use. current system of designators was adopted from WARC-79. It has a thousand different ITU recognized emission designator combinations. y a small portion of which we use in amateur radio) had the undesirable side effect of eliminating certain types of rileges that amateurs used to have. e of the most glaring concerned Al, Morse Code. There are many ferent designators for CW ... such as telegraphy received by ear, received by machine, ... and so forth. You have all of these different ignators covering various types of keyed telegraphy. It was never our ention of outlawing any of them. Unfortunately the new desgnators had t effect since each is very specific.", said Paul Rinaldo, W4RI, (editor QST and author of a working paper on Designations of Emissions in the teur Service. new designators proposed by the FCC eliminate the large number in the system with only 9. They are as follows: single channel amplitude-shift-keyed telegraphy in International CW Morse Code for aural or automatic reception. single channel modulated tone telegraphy emissions in International Morse Code for aural or automatic reception. MCW telephony/voice emissions. single channel emissions for television and facsimile, etc. single channel emissions for narrow-band direct printing. PHONE IMAGE RTTY digital data including packet. DATA pulse emissions. PULSE spread spectrum emissions. emissions containing no modulation or information used for on air SS transmitter adjustment, two-tone amplifier linearity testing, TEST antenna measurement, direction finding, ranging, etc. ep in mind that these changes are still in the proposal stage and will t be signed into "law" until proper public comment has taken place. 
