Our purpose was to see what went right and what went wrong with the 1988 Hamfest. ON the agenda were 25 items open for discussion. To put your mind at ease, we did not change policy, we will continue to operate our Hamfest in the normal way. This meeting was to generate new ideas and seek to improve our way of operating the succeding OVH Hamfests.

Some of the items discussed were:

- 1.A. Main entrance: Due to the large number of cars leaving early, we must have clearly marked entrance and exit signs.

Woman Judge Throws Curve At PRB-1:

PRB-1, the so-called Amateur antenna law, recently had Federal Judge Zita Weinshienk make a ruling that may distort the meaning and intent of the original law if allowed to stand. In Boulder, CO, she ruled that two hams . . . could not violate a 35 foot county height restriction because there were other hams in the county that could furnish emergency communications if needed.

She ruled that PRB-1 did not apply to individual operators but to the Amateur Radio Service as a whole. Whether it was prejudice or missing the point and intent of the law, she suggessted that if hams wanted to put up high antennas there were many other spaces in the county that this could be done. (Can you imagine this from a Judge!)

An appeal is now pending in the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals in Denver. The problem and an evergrowing one for this Service is that legal fees cost money. A drive is now on to assist the two Amateurs. Contributions may be made to the Boulder Antenna Legal Defense Fund, 5338 Spotted Horse Trail, Boulder, CO, 80301. (B-N-T Bulletin, Oct 1988 Issue).






