

The Field Day Committee Chairman, Bonnie (N4QPB), reported that she sent a letter to the Prince William County Park Authority for the same site we had last year. A Field Day Committee meeting will be held sometime in mid-May.

Butch (N6NSM) reported that the Club is in need of a new Refreshments Chairman and no one has so far volunteered. If you are interested in providing this MOST ESSENTIAL service, please contact Butch ASAP.

What's New

Solar power technology has advanced considerably in the last few years and is now a viable option for radio use. There are many solar panels available but with all of them, you need a charge controller to regulate the power between the solar panel and your radio equipment.

A good charge controller is the M-8 or M-16 charge controller by Sun Selectors. These charge controllers are electronic devices that are designed for use with today's thin film or polycrystalline solar panels. The M-8 is a 6-8 amp max controller and the M-16 is a 15 amp controller.

The charge controller's main function is to take the variable 13 - 18 volts produced by the solar panel, and regulate the output to 13.8 volts DC. Once the batter has reached it's fully charged capacity, the M-8 will disconnect the panel's incoming voltage and indicate ready. It will also briefly switch the solar panel's charging voltage off, which allows the battery to basically catch it's breath. Technically it allows the battery to rest and chemically comes to a brief halt.

The M-8 and M-16 charge controllers by Sun Selectors are available through local retail solar panel dealers. I purchased my panel and controller from Hutton Communications in Norcross. Georgia (800-741-3811). I have been impressed with the M-8 charge controller, it's so reliable you can set it and forget it. Someday I hope to acquire enough solar panels to require a M-16, 15 amp controller.

Packet Bursts

So, you say you've been on vacation for the last week or two and you really want to catch up on your packet reading? How should you attack this problem? You know if you simply connect to the board and enter "L" vou're going to have to sit in front of your terminal for at least a half hour waiting for all the messages to scroll by! Wouldn't it be nice if you could get some control over the BBS and "calm it down" a little bit?

Well, there is a way for you to gain control; through variations on the "L" command. The first you should probably do after connecting to the board is "LM". LM stands for List Mine. This will show you all messages that the board has which are specifically addressed to you. Read your messages send some replies if you choose to and then, of course, don't forget to kill them.

The next "L" command you should probably use is L@. The @ stands for at. This command comes in handy if you're interested in seeing specific messages addressed to specific distribution lists. All packeteers in OVH are part of a distribution list called OVH. You would enter L@ OVH to view all message titles which were addressed to OVH members while you were out of town.

Another good "L" command is LA. LA followed by a number will show you the oldest N messages on the board. For example, LA 20 would show you

the oldest twenty messages currently on the board. take the number of the twentieth oldest message on the board, add one to that number and then add twenty to that number and use the L # # command to see the 21st oldest message through the 41st oldest message. For example, you enter LA 20 and see that the oldest message on the system is 100 and since you asked for the oldest 20, you'll see the contents of messages 100 through 119. adding 1 to 119 (for 120) and adding 20 to that (140) you can enter L120 140 to see contents of those messages. By re-doing this little trick, you'll be able to control the listing and view 20 message titles at a time and you will be in control of the board. (I chose 20 because that is what my software is capable of displaying on one screen modify your needs.)

Finally, if you choose to check the newest messages instead of the oldest, you can use the LL command followed by a number. so you might enter LL 20 to see the newest 20 messages. Then, using the same technique (only backwards) that we used with the LA command, you could go through the messages on the board from newest to oldest instead of from oldest to newest.

I hope this information has been helpful and that it has shown you how you can gain control of the BBS.





The "Ole Virginia Hams" would like to take this opportunity to introduce our Club to you.

This non-profit club is organized exclusively for the educational and scintific study of electronics and communication, and to provide amateur communication services for public service. The "Ole Virginia Hams" are associated with the American Radio Relay League and the Foundation for Amateur Radio.

The Club operates a Repeater, (WA4FPM) on the 2 meter frequency of 146.37/97 Mhz and on 220 Mhz at 223.06/224.66. The Repeater is located at the Northern Virginia Electric Coop Building, 10323 Lomond Drive, Manassas, Virginia. Our Repeater operates on a 24-hour basis and is equipped with sufficient battery power to operate at low power for 24 hours should the main commercial power fail. Under normal operating conditions, the repeater allows for two-way communication coverage of Prince William County, some of Loudoun County plus some of Fauquier County and even Washington, DC.

Some of the activities the Ole Virginia Hams are involved with:

- * Provide Training Classes
- * Provide Scholarships for students in Manassas, Manassas Park and Prince William County
- * Own, operate and maintain a communications repeater on the Northern Virginia Electric Coop tower that can be used for emergency communications in time of need
- * Sponsor and produce the Annual Manassas Hamfest and Computer Fair to promote Amateur Radio and to give an opportunity for other amateur radio operators to visit Manassas. (The Hamfest and Computer Fair is the Club's sole fund-raising event--it provides the funds for the other community-service activities.)
- * Provide communications, free of charge, for charitable groups—Bike-a-thons, Walk-a-thons, the Annual Christmas Parade, Joe Gibb's Youth for Tomorrow Fair, and many others. The list grows each year.
- * Participate in Red Cross emergency preparedness drills and similar programs held within Prince William County and surrounding areas.
- * Participate in the world-wide Amateur Radio Field Day -- an exercise in emergency communications preparedness with amateurs across the United States, Canada, etc.

The "Ole Virginia Hams Amateur Radio Club" holds its meetings on the third Monday of every month (except November) at 8:00 PM, in the meeting room of the Northern Virginia Coop Building, 10323 Lomond Drive, Manassas, Virginia. We cordially welcome all visitors.


