MINUTES OF OVH MEETING NOVEMBER 21, 1997

Charlie/WA4YGI, called the meeting to order at 8PM with the Pledge of Allegiance, oral roll call, and signing the attendance sheet. There were 24 members and 1 guest present.

OLD BUSINESS

Charlie reported that Rick/KU3M, has not yet heard from NOVEC concerning continued OVH use of the community room. Rick will continue to investigate the matter.

COMMITTEES

Treasurer – Jeff/KF4JSV, presented the Treasurer's report. It was accepted without questions.

Technical – Art/KU4MI, has the new controller and will schedule when each repeater will be down. He will give notice ahead of time for each repeater. In addition, Art is coordinating OVH efforts for the Manassas Christmas Parade and requested a few more volunteers.

Packet – Bill/N4WJN, is investigating whether to upgrade or replace the current units. The cost would be approximately \$260.00 vs. \$580.00

ARES – Erv/KT4DS, provided lists of the NCAC frequencies. He also brought in a box of rechargeable batteries, donated by Perrott Batteries of Falls Church, for OVH members to use as backup power supplies.

Hamfest – Jack/N4YIC, received a letter from the ARRL that the 1998 OVH Hamfest has been approved as an ARRL sponsored event. He also has received the contract for the Fair Grounds for 1999.

PROGRAM

Following the break, Harry/W4PVA, presented a program on his experiences with radio and electronics during WW II. He flew in carrier based patrol flights and dive-bombers early in the war. As an example of the gear, he discussed the ZB unit, which operated on 240 MHz, modulated by 1 to 5 KHz, which served as a bearing and direction finder for carrier based flights. He later taught classes introducing new flight crews to the radio and electrical systems on the planes. As the teacher he could set specific malfunctions for the students to discover and correct. Harry brought in photos of the full-scale mockups that were used in the training. Aside from the general interest in radio communications of the period, Harry noted that ham radio operators were able to use their experience with the hobby to fix, maintain and sometimes improve the radio gear. (Hams enlisted by the thousands to provide this support during the war.) Also, as an example of how things have changed, he noted that a "portable" radio on board ships could be 8 feet tall and had to be lifted into place with a crane. After his talk, Harry answered questions from the members. (Several members, too young to remember WW II, commented on how interesting it was to hear about the rigors and capabilities of the radiomen and their gear by someone who lived through it.)

50 - 50 was won by **Steve/N4OGR**. The meeting adjourned at 8:52 PM.

1997 Manassas Christmas Parade Communications Support

My thanks to all the people who supported the parade effort this year. We had enough people to staff all positions (and then some): Milt/N4SN, Jim/WD4OJY, Jim/WA4LTO, Joe/AB4QV, Larry/KA4CTX, Lisa/KF4FJD, Ellie/KF4NBO, Frank/K3TRM, Jeff/KF4JSV, Matt/KC4ZPM, Butch/W4HJL, Mary Lu/KB4EFP, Harry/W4PVA, Bill/N4WJN, Cathy/AE4UM, Erv/KT4DS and Art/KU4MI.

A new wrinkle was added this year. Ricky Ratcliffe and the Chamber of Commerce volunteers, who direct the operation, have purchased hand-held transceivers and advised that they didn't need our help in the staging areas and in the lead police car, as we have provided in the past.

Fortunately, there were no emergencies requiring assistance, although, it appears that a fire at the Manassas fire station kitchen created a "little stir." Only one instance of safety concern occurred when one of the parade float groups tossed candy into the crowd. 97 of 99 units participated in the parade and it looks like everyone had a good time (albeit a cold one). The first unit stepped off promptly at 1030 and crossed in front of the judge's stand at 1105. The last unit (Santa Claus) crossed the starting line at 1210 and finished at 1249. Clean up and egress were the usual zoo for an hour afterwards.

There were a few lessons learned for future events - "don't lose track of any of your team ... know where they are at all times" - Sorry, Jim!


