


There is a possibility that **Annaburg Manor** and **Prince William Hospital** will be added to the list of those who need our help.

CW FUN

Another shot at convincing people that CW can be fun. For some of us it can be humbling too. I mean, don't get puffed up too much, Mr. "Bug-Man"!! (KW4AW discovers that it only SOUNDS like he's copying 20 wpm ... it really turns out to be 13!). Trying to get to the point, one can have fun building CW rigs as well as operating them. The bug on the wall says that construction is progressing on some PIXIE-2 kits that arrived in Manassas not too long ago. A PIXIE-2 is small fully functional CW transceiver that, so far, has been tried on 80 meters and 40 meters. In case you haven't tried it or thought about it, simple kits can yield more than simple results. Several kits are being built around town that soon will be operating on 3.6864 kHz. Pick a kit, or find a construction article, and build a new "shack companion" for the new year. PIXIE-2 examples are shown in the accompanying photographs.






Our "Fighting Hams" Heritage

The January 2000 issue of "QST" magazine carries an excellent story by Jim Maxwell, W6CF, describing in detail the achievements and contributions of amateur radio operators during the past 100 years. Jim also cites a few of the historical events that serve to remind us it was amateur radio operators of yesteryear who established this proud, contributing, and community-spirited service organization we are all part of.

World War I started in 1914 in Europe. By 1917, the U.S. was involved and all Ham radio operations in the U.S. ceased. However, Hams were the only trained radio operators available, and eventually some 4,000 of them served during WW-I. Amateur radio operating privileges were restored in 1919.

In 1939 World War II erupted in Europe; 1941 brought the bombing of Pearl Harbor, drawing the U.S. into the conflict. Once again all amateur radio activities were curtailed except for Hams serving as members of the War Emergency Radio Service. At that time circa 60,000 Americans were licensed Hams. It is estimated that during WW-II 25,000 Hams served in the armed forces, and another 25,000 served in critical war industries, or as instructors in military schools. WW-II ended in August 1945 and, by mid-1946 nearly all amateur radio operating privileges had been restored.

Whether serving this nation at home or abroad, Hams earned ample recognition, as evidenced by this envelope of the times:



And yes, it was the same in Korea, Vietnam, Panama, Saudi Arabia, and every military conflict following WW-II; Hams served when and where needed. Moreover, Hams at home manned their radios to provide untold thousands of those all-important, morale building "phone patch" telephone calls from those abroad to their loved ones here in the U.S. Through these significant contributions, Hams truly earned their radio operating privileges.

Ham radio is far more than just a hobby. When you become a Ham, you have bragging rights to a long, proud, hard-earned heritage. Keeping this fine tradition going is our job now, so do what you can to promote amateur radio, and use your skills and talents to contribute when and where you can in your local community.
