DRAFT OF DECEMBER 20 1999 MINUTES

The meeting started at 8:02 PM. After the pledge of allegiance, all present stated their name and call sign. There were 16 members and 2 guests present.

Some of the developments Harry talked about were the use of a crystal radio with the earphones on a bowl to allow his family to listen, the development of the vacuum tube, the use of galvanometers to detect current flow, the use of battery powered home receivers, the reason for labeling of the batteries as A, B, and C cells. A fox hunt with the local ham club where Harry was operating the fox transmitter, and hid on the top of a car lift inside a service station. Also a discussion of the development of the transistor. This was a very interesting talk. Thank You Harry.

Break:

Temproary Outage of N4WJN/BBSNVA Packet BBS

Well, while I made sure that Y2K didn't affect any systems where I work, I wasn't as proactive on my ham systems. I find that my old BBS software has a real problem dealing with the year 2000. It seems to scramble the dates on listings of messages, as well as the date header it puts on the message. Since I can't allow this system to corrupt messages it handles and forwards to the ham packet network, my BBSNVA/N4WJN BBS system will be temporarily off the air.

This outage will only be until I decide how I want to handle the situation. I want to take this as an opportunity to possibly move to a **more robust system**, rather than just upgrading to the latest version of the same software I have been using for the last 10 years, if that is the best thing to do for the packet user community.

One of my systems is still operational, however not yet receiving and sending "normal" ham packet mail...that is my IPNVA/N4WJN-2 JNOS system. You can still log into it on 145.03 direct (not a very good signal unless you live close to me). The recommended path is from NIHRAC node, as I currently don't seem to have a very good signal into OVH node. On IPNVA you can currently only send/receive e-mail to/from the Internet; I hope to make time this weekend to get the standard packet mail flowing to that system, at least as an interim measure.

So, hang in there if you're still a packet user, I'm not going away like so many other sysops have lately. It's just a temporary glitch. With any luck I'll be back even better quite soon.

New Virginia ARRL Vehicle License Tags

Dennis Bodson/W4PWF, our Roanoke Division Vice Director, is leading the effort to have the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) issue a new style vehicle license tag for amateur radio operators in the commonwealth.

The proposed tag design is really beautiful and was on display at our 1999 Manassas Hamfest. It has "VIRGINIA" across the top in burnt orange letters, and "American Radio Relay League" across the bottom in yellow letters. The scene conveys a typical sundown (yellow/burnt orange) color setting. Your call sign will be in the center of the tag in large blue characters. To the right of your call sign there is a ARRL logo in black and yellow and, to the far right, pictured against a setting sun, is a typical trylon tower with a four-element antenna at the top. The scene includes a person climbing the tower.


Dennis recently reported that we still need 200 more Virginia amateurs to indicate a willingness to purchase these tags before the DMV will initiate production and dissemination.
