Results of the November 13, 2012 VEC License Examination Session

The VEC examination session was originally scheduled for November 13th at 7:00 pm to be a week after the finish of the Technician License class which was taught by Mark / WA4KFZ. The VEC session was held at the Red Cross location on Liberia Avenue with VEC examiners Mark / WA3KFZ, John / KG4NXT and Steve / N4OGR. At the session, exams were given for the Technician, General and Extra Class licenses.

There were 16 examinees and all were successful at this session, i.e. all obtained either a new, first time, license or an upgrade for an existing license. There was a lot of smiling and cheering as the applicants got word that they had been successful. As of this writing, the new licensees are awaiting the FCC's assignment of their callsigns. The exam session was open to There were more walk-in than usual, including several who had not taken Mark's class.

One of the examinee's was George Sullivan, ex-WD4RPF, a pre-1987 Technican. Back then the content of the Technican written exam was the same as the General exam, but the General had to pass a 13 wpm Morse code test while the Technician only needed to pass a 5 word per minute Morse code test. [There is no longer any Morse code test requirement.] Under a special rule for pre-1987 Technicans, George automatically became a General when he passed the current Technician test! He should be able to get his old callsign back if he wants it.

Two of the examinees were under age 18 and both passed. Gavin Saul (and his dad who also passed the Techician exam) got exposed to and interested in ham radio the booth at the Prince William County Fair in August. Both Gavin and his father attended Mark's class. Lillian Diamond, now in the 10th grade at Battlefield High School, has operated OVH's GOTA HF stations at four past OVH Field Days. She was a self-study examinee. Both of these young people say they intend to go on and get more advanced licenses.

Spotlight on an OVH Member

Wayne / AG4ZZ

I joined OVH the same year I got my ticket, in 2002. I am also a member of ARRL, NAQCC, and NOVA QRP. I currently work for the Prince William County Schools as an Electronics Tech, mostly on intercom and CATV systems.

I worked with a ham that got me interested in amateur radio. It was mostly OVH club members who helped me get further oriented in the hobby. I am a dedicated CW (Morse code) operator on HF, and also

enjoy working with QRP (low power). I also listen to shortwave broadcasting stations and visit the AM broadcast band for news/talk radio.

Here is the in my ham shack: Kenwood TS480SAT. Yaesu VX5 HT, Kenwood TS520SE, Kenwood THF6A HT. Index Labs QRP+, Icom 703, Rockmite 40m, Homebrew 40m tube Transmitter. ATS-3A Band HF Transceiver. Heathkit HW-8, Yaesu 2m Transceiver and Yaesu Dual Band Transceiver (Mobile).



The antennas I'm currently using are: a wire inverted L doublet fed with ladder line and a 6 element 2m yagi with an armstrong rotater which appears to my neighbors to be TV antenna, my house being the last one in the neighborhood to still feature an outdoor yagi TV antenna!

My shack is in the dining room and everything is stacked on a wheeled microwave cart so I can roll it out for serious use or move it back into the corner for listening.

I enjoy participating in Field Day, special event stations, JOTA, the Manassas Hamfest and Thursday night nets. Sprint contests are fun as are any portable operations.

An article and an email about operating with the JT65 on the HF bands by OVH members:

My Fun With JT65 on HF - Arthur R. Whittum, W1CRO

Some ago I read an article written by David Witkowski, W6DTW and Tomas Hood, NW7US, about a digital mode called JT65A. It sounded like fun. It was different. And it was a "weak signal mode", which meant that my lowly dipole might garner some contacts that were not possible using other digital modes. I lost track of the article (CQ Magazine, October 2010) but found a copy on the Internet - here is a link to the two part article http://nw7us.us/jt65a.html.

The authors state that "JT65A is actually a 'submode' of the original JT65 protocol (from Nobel prize awardee Joe Taylor, K1JT), which Joe designed to optimize EME contacts on the HF and VHF bands. JT65 includes error-correcting features that make it very robust, even with signals much too weak to be heard. It was later realized that this protocol, with some adaptation, would also be very Continued on page 7

usable for terrestrial HF communications." "Joe" is Dr Joe Taylor, K1JT. Have you heard of WSJT? It is short for Weak Signal/Joe Taylor. Check out Joe's web page at http://physics.princeton.edu/pulsar/K1JT/. Thanks to Dr. Joe Taylor we have some outstanding software for EME, meteor scatter and weak signal HF work. Also thanks to Joe Large, W6CQZ (now W4CQZ), who branched off from the main WSJT codebase and developed the JT65-HF software package.

I looked at both WSJT and the JT65-HF software packages (both are free, by the way) and selected JT65-HF because it had a "small graphic unit interface" (GUI) that

fit better on my little NetBook screen. If you are interested in trying JT65A, please read both the articles written by Witkowski and Hood and the Joe Taylor web page before you start. They contain everything you need to know.

I have used JT65-HF software for JT65A operation on all bands except 1.8 MHz and 5.0 MHz with very good results. This with a good vertical antenna, a poor vertical antenna, a sloping loop only 20 ft off the ground, a 40 meter dipole at 25 ft and an off-center fed dipole at 35 ft. The highest antenna with the largest capture area was best, of course, but I still made contacts in Japan and Australia running 9 watts to a vertical. I need to throw


up some more wire for 160 meters and try that band now. Oh - JT65A? It is a short designator for HF; JT65B is for VHF, and JT65C is for UHF.

During JT65A operation from 23 May thru 23 September 2012, I made 507 contacts on almost all bands between 80 meters and 10 meters (I skipped 60 meters because I have never operated that band and first need to get familiar with the channelized operation there). Some of my contacts included individuals that I contacted on more than one band. I never used more than 50 watts to a dipole antenna and usually cruised along at 20 - 35 watts. In some cases I reduced power until I lost contact and then increased power slightly to regain communications. My best contacts were Japan and Australia at 9 watts output.

I usually started on 10 meters and kept going until I ran out of new contacts, then dropped down to 12, then 15, then 17 meters. 20 meters, for me, was a nightmare. Too many signals and trash all over the place - partly because my NetBook sound card isn't that great and I couldn't find the right combination of attenuation and filtering to make things better. So, although I did make some contacts on 20 meters, I generally stuck to the other bands. Perhaps I'll go back

and try again some time. Finally roosted on 30 meters for a while and made some good contacts there. And, then on the last day of this little adventure I finally made it to 40 meters, with a quick dip to 80 meters just to "get one for the log".

Here is a breakdown of contacts: Oops! I just discovered that I lost one of my "dupe sheets". I have 507 contacts uploaded to Logbook of The World (LoTW) and only 489 on my dupe sheets. So one sheet missing. But this will give you an idea of the spread. According to my remaining dupe sheets, I had contacts on the following bands: 80 meters - 1 contact; 40 meters - 7 contacts; 30 meters - 86 contacts; 20 meters - 52

contacts; 17 meters - 142 contacts; 15 meters - 107 contacts; 12 meters - 33 contacts; 10 meters - 61 contacts. The missing sheet would probably show more contacts on 15 and 17 meters. According to LoTW, I have 319 out of 507 confirmed. They show that I worked all US call areas and 47 countries located in North America, South America, the Caribbean, Greenland, Scandinavia, Europe, Asia, Australia and New Zealand. Not bad for four months of part-time contact hunting.

So give it a try. You can find the JT65A operating frequencies here: http://hflink.com/jt65/>. For more encouragement, read the May 2012 QST article "who's on JT65?" by Steve Ford, WB8IMY. Of note is - Sergey Kohno, UR3CTB is mentioned in the article. He is running 30 watts to a low wire dipole. I contacted Sergey on 17 meters using 30 watts to my OCFD which was pretty low at the time. That contact was 4956.8 miles, point-to-point. So it doesn't take a lot of power or a five element beam to make a lot of contacts. I recently raised the OCFD to 65 ft. Now to see it makes any difference.

Well, this has been a good weekend for me. I finally got that "final elusive" QSO - the last state in the pursuit of Worked All States (WAS) on JT65. I worked West Virginia, KD8EZS, on 11-Nov-2012 at 23:28Z down on 80M using "JT65a" mode. It only took me 18 days from start to finish - from downloading the JT65-HF & JT-Alert software to having WAS on the mode - I think that is a new personal record for me! Of all places, who would have expected my next door neighbor, WV, to be the last hold out.Now, we need to convince others in the club to try it.; -) JT-65-HF States worked or confirmed: 50 (see table)
