Summary: a total of 9 candidates appeared for at least one exam. 11 exams were issued and taken. There were more candidate attendees at this session than usual because the OVH had cancelled the previously scheduled May 24, 2025 session due to conflict with Memorial Day weekend.

As a result of the exams, the following Licenses were earned: Extra: 1; General: 2; and

Technician: 6. One applicant passed both Technician and General. One applicant passed the Technician but, despite a valiant effort, did not pass the General exam.

A huge round of applause to the OVH VEs who made this possible. David / KG4GIY, Ken / KN4DD, James / KM4SXM and James / KQ4CAX. A special shout out to Byron / AK4XR who showed up early in the morning to see if an additional VE was needed, but feeling under the weather, he headed back home. 


My First Meteor Scatter Contact During the August Perseids Meteor Shower by John / KG4NXT

I was first licensed as a young ham operator in 1964 in Iowa but now, 61 years later, I have just had my very first Meteor Scatter contact during the August 2025 Perseids meteor shower. Bruce / KN4GDX helped as did Rich / K1HTV of the Fauquier Amateur Radio Association for their help. Thanks to both!

Most radio skip occurs when our RF signals bounce (i.e. are scattered or reflected) off of an ionized layer of gas molecules in the part of the earth's upper atmosphere known as the ionosphere. The gas molecules in that atmospheric layer have been ionized by high energy radiation from the sun. For meteor scatter, on the other hand, the ionization of gas molecules is provided by energy from very high speed meteors that have entered the upper atmosphere and is being dissipated as the meteors burn up from the heat caused by collisions with gas molecules. Meteor scatter caused ionization is very short lived because recombination to an non-ionized state occurs in the gas molecules once the ionization energy source (meteor burn up) ceases

On the evening of August 10, 2025, I made my first meteor scatter contacts. I used the MSK144 mode of WSJT-X on 6 meters - 50.260 MHZ bouncing off the ionized meteor paths caused by the Persieds meteor shower.

The stations I worked were AB4GA and WA4CQG, both in Alabama. I was also heard in Iowa and Illinois. See below the screen capture from the PSK Reporter system.

Here the description from Rich / K1HTV of how the MSK144 mode came into use for meteor scatter contacts: The Perseids meteor shower is a 24 hour a day shower. Unlike many other showers, it does not set. The problem is that the guys playing with meteors

tend to operate in the late evening hour or again at dawn. In my 60 plus years of doing meteor showers, I've made 2-way Perseids contacts at all hours of the day. In the old days we would set up skeds using Snail mail. The skeds were CW, but when SSB came around, we found that mode to be a better way to take advantage of the short bursts. Then in 2001, Joe Taylor, K1JT, introduced MSK441 as a component of his WSIn 2001, the name was changed to MSK144 when it was added to the WSJT-X program. With MSK144 being far superior to SSB, almost all M/S work is now done using this digital mode. It takes only milliseconds to send an MSK144 packet containing calls and grids, or calls and reports, or the calls and rogers, or calls and 73 messages. It's a lot faster than SSB.

If you have WSJT-X working and can operate on the 6 or 10 meter bands, you are almost there for trying out meteor scatter. Example: select the MSK144 mode and the 6 meter band. The center frequency for meteor scatter is 50.260 for 6 meters and 28.145 MHz on the 10 meter band. Select odd (meaning uncheck the even box). If you log to the Internet on WSJT-X, the data will be used for scientific study. If nothing seems to be happening, just let your radio go overnight or for an extended period of time. You may have to adjust your computer's "sleep" settings so it stays awake. There are lots of hams on the PSK Reporter network so you are likely to get picked up by someone at a distance. See screen capture to the right where my station was heard in New Hampshire!

Most people are on meteor scatter at 6 am plus or minus 3 hours even though, as Rich / K1HTV noted, the Perseids can be worked all day during their peak (August 9 -14). One of my Perseids meteor scatter

contacts was with WU5X in Alabama around noontime. You may hear also some local fellows hams on ground wave on MSK144 and work them too. but that is not meteor scatter unless the station is between 400 and 1200 miles from you. 73 - John / KG4NXT
