Some Possibly Interesting or Useful Information

A few years ago the ARRL started to make all of its periodicals (QST, QEX, NCJ, etc.) available online to each of its active members, and began encouraging its members to use just the online versions instead of continuing to receive printed copies. The online versions save the costs of paper copy printing and mailing, but when all periodicals were put online, the ARRL also could no longer collect separate subscription charges for QEX and NCJ. Many or most of OVH's members are also ARRL members so the current

status of this situation should be of interest to most readers of this Newsletter.

Your editor recently went online again to see how this is working out, but did not check out the iPad, Android table or Kindle apps which the ARRL has also made available. The URL for web browser access is https://www.arrl.org/arrl-magazines and to use that, you must first input your Login Username and Password as an ARRL member.

The four current online periodicals now available online are: 1. QST for Nov. 2025 (132 pages); 2. QEX, the ARRL's technical journal, for Sept/Oct 2025 (32 pages); 3. NCJ, the ARRL's radio contesting journal for Oct/Nov 2025 (32 pages) and 4. On the Air, ARRL's periodical oriented to relatively new hams, for Nov. 2025. (36 pages). Each can easily be downloaded as a full color PDF file or read online.

Worth checking out. It's a lot easier to store these periodicals as PDF files for future reference on a hard drive or USB thumb drive than accumulate stacks of paper copies.

Because US call signs are not authorized for use in Ecuador, Don's HC4DA call sign was



Some More Possibly Interesting or Useful Information

Mark / WA4KFZ's presentation in September about the June 2025 Friedrichshafen Hamfest he had attended, had me paying special attention to the post-event reviews of that Hamfest in the two main German ham magazines. One of the interesting items reported in both described the 13 year old Romanian ham prodigy (YO8YNS) who had just set a new high speed Morse code copying world record on a live stage before an audience at the Hamfest by copying Morse code from the RufzXP software, beating his own prior world record. The current version of that free software [https://www.rufzxp.net] runs on everything from Windows 11 back to before Windows XP.

That web site has links to audio streams of the word PARIS being sent over and over in Morse code at speeds from 10 wpm to more than 200 wpm and may be worth listening to if you have interest in using Morse code. When I first concentrated on learning Morse code to get my ham license at age 14, the world's high speed CW champion then could decode in his head and type the decoded text to a typewriter at up to 70 wpm with "solid" copy. The championship tests with RufzXP do not require "solid copy" but do require accurate copying of ham call signs at very high speeds, now above 200 wpm! To me, that seems utterly impossible! For me at least, above about 50 to 60 wpm, CW audio word sounds run together and begin to sound like a
